Associations of "Alerting" (30 Words)

advised	Having the benefit of careful prior consideration or counsel. <i>A well advised delay in carrying out the plan.</i>
<u>attentive</u>	Paying close attention to something. The hotel has a pleasant atmosphere and attentive service.
aware	Bearing in mind; attentive to. Became aware of her surroundings.
<u>beware</u>	Be on one's guard; be cautious or wary about; be alert to. We should beware the incompetence of legislators.
<u>careful</u>	Unhurried and with care and dignity. A careful consideration of the facts.
carefully	In a way that deliberately avoids harm or errors; cautiously. They must be carefully handled and stored.



<u>cautious</u>	People who are fearful and cautious. Reserved and cautious never making swift decisions.
<u>chary</u>	Cautiously or suspiciously reluctant to do something. She had been chary of telling the whole truth.
circumspect	Wary and unwilling to take risks. <i>Circumspect</i> actions.
conscientious	Guided by or in accordance with conscience or sense of right and wrong. <i>Conscientious</i> application to the work at hand.
conscious	Knowing and perceiving; having awareness of surroundings and sensations and thoughts. <i>They were growing increasingly security conscious.</i>
<u>discreet</u>	Unobtrusively perceptive and sympathetic. We made some discreet inquiries.
<u>discreetly</u>	In a careful and prudent manner, especially in order to keep something confidential or to avoid embarrassment. <i>She coughed discreetly</i> .
forethought	Planning or plotting in advance of acting. Jim had the forethought to book in advance.
heed	Pay close attention to give heed to. <i>He spends without heed to the consequences.</i>
measured	Having a slow, regular rhythm. She set off with measured tread.
<u>mindful</u>	Bearing in mind; attentive to. A mindful approach to life helps us to let go of the stress that often comes with conflicts in relationships.
observant	Adhering strictly to the rules of a particular religion, especially Judaism. Observant of the speed limit.
<u>perfunctory</u>	Done or produced as a formality only. <i>Perfunctory courtesy</i> .
precaution	A precautionary measure warding off impending danger or damage or injury etc. <i>He put an ice pack on the injury as a precaution.</i>
precision	The quality of being reproducible in amount or performance. Note the meticulous precision of his measurements.
<u>prudent</u>	Acting with or showing care and thought for the future. A prudent manager.



scrupulous	(of a person or process) careful, thorough, and extremely attentive to details. <i>Scrupulous</i> attention to details.
sleepless	Experiencing or accompanied by sleeplessness Shakespeare. <i>The sleepless river.</i>
solicitous	Full of anxiety and concern. <i>Solicitous</i> about her health.
thoughtful	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. How very thoughtful of you.
<u>unobtrusive</u>	Not conspicuous or attracting attention. The service was unobtrusive and efficient.
vigilant	Keeping careful watch for possible danger or difficulties. The vigilant eye of the town watch.
wary	Feeling or showing caution about possible dangers or problems. A wary look.
watchful	Experiencing or accompanied by sleeplessness. They attended dances under the watchful eye of their father.
