### **Definitions of "Alerting" as a noun**

- *A state of readiness to respond.*
- *An automatic signal (usually a sound) warning of danger.*

- alertness** The process of paying close and continuous attention.  
*A lack of mental **alertness**.*

## Associations of "Alerting" (30 Words)

<b>advised</b>	Having the benefit of careful prior consideration or counsel. <i>A well <b>advised</b> delay in carrying out the plan.</i>
<b><u>attentive</u></b>	Paying close attention to something. <i>The hotel has a pleasant atmosphere and <b>attentive</b> service.</i>
<b>aware</b>	Bearing in mind; attentive to. <i>Became <b>aware</b> of her surroundings.</i>
<b><u>beware</u></b>	Be on one's guard; be cautious or wary about; be alert to. <i>We should <b>beware</b> the incompetence of legislators.</i>
<b><u>careful</u></b>	Unhurried and with care and dignity. <i>A <b>careful</b> consideration of the facts.</i>
<b>carefully</b>	In a way that deliberately avoids harm or errors; cautiously. <i>They must be <b>carefully</b> handled and stored.</i>



<b>cautious</b>	People who are fearful and cautious. <i>Reserved and <b>cautious</b> never making swift decisions.</i>
<b>chary</b>	Cautiously or suspiciously reluctant to do something. <i>She had been <b>chary</b> of telling the whole truth.</i>
<b>circumspect</b>	Wary and unwilling to take risks. <i><b>Circumspect</b> actions.</i>
<b>conscientious</b>	Guided by or in accordance with conscience or sense of right and wrong. <i><b>Conscientious</b> application to the work at hand.</i>
<b>conscious</b>	Knowing and perceiving; having awareness of surroundings and sensations and thoughts. <i>They were growing increasingly security <b>conscious</b>.</i>
<b>discreet</b>	Unobtrusively perceptive and sympathetic. <i>We made some <b>discreet</b> inquiries.</i>
<b>discreetly</b>	In a careful and prudent manner, especially in order to keep something confidential or to avoid embarrassment. <i>She coughed <b>discreetly</b>.</i>
<b>forethought</b>	Planning or plotting in advance of acting. <i>Jim had the <b>forethought</b> to book in advance.</i>
<b>heed</b>	Pay close attention to give heed to. <i>He spends without <b>heed</b> to the consequences.</i>
<b>measured</b>	Having a slow, regular rhythm. <i>She set off with <b>measured</b> tread.</i>
<b>mindful</b>	Bearing in mind; attentive to. <i>A <b>mindful</b> approach to life helps us to let go of the stress that often comes with conflicts in relationships.</i>
<b>observant</b>	Adhering strictly to the rules of a particular religion, especially Judaism. <i><b>Observant</b> of the speed limit.</i>
<b>perfunctory</b>	Done or produced as a formality only. <i><b>Perfunctory</b> courtesy.</i>
<b>precaution</b>	A precautionary measure warding off impending danger or damage or injury etc. <i>He put an ice pack on the injury as a <b>precaution</b>.</i>
<b>precision</b>	The quality of being reproducible in amount or performance. <i>Note the meticulous <b>precision</b> of his measurements.</i>
<b>prudent</b>	Acting with or showing care and thought for the future. <i>A <b>prudent</b> manager.</i>

<b>scrupulous</b>	(of a person or process) careful, thorough, and extremely attentive to details. <i><b>Scrupulous</b> attention to details.</i>
<b>sleepless</b>	Experiencing or accompanied by sleeplessness Shakespeare. <i>The <b>sleepless</b> river.</i>
<b>solicitous</b>	Full of anxiety and concern. <i><b>Solicitous</b> about her health.</i>
<b>thoughtful</b>	Taking heed giving close and thoughtful attention. <i>How very <b>thoughtful</b> of you.</i>
<b><u>unobtrusive</u></b>	Not conspicuous or attracting attention. <i>The service was <b>unobtrusive</b> and efficient.</i>
<b>vigilant</b>	Keeping careful watch for possible danger or difficulties. <i>The <b>vigilant</b> eye of the town watch.</i>
<b>wary</b>	Feeling or showing caution about possible dangers or problems. <i>A <b>wary</b> look.</i>
<b>watchful</b>	Experiencing or accompanied by sleeplessness. <i>They attended dances under the <b>watchful</b> eye of their father.</i>
