### Definitions of "Alias" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “alias” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A name that has been assumed temporarily.*
- *An alternative name or label that refers to a file, command, address, or other item, and can be used to locate or access it.*
- *Each of a set of signal frequencies which, when sampled at a given uniform rate, would give the same set of sampled values, and thus might be incorrectly substituted for one another when reconstructing the original signal.*
- *A false or assumed identity.*

### Synonyms of "Alias" as a noun (5 Words)

**false name** A language unit by which a person or thing is known.

**incognito** An assumed or false identity.  
*She is locked in her **incognito**.*

**nickname** A familiar or humorous name given to a person or thing instead of or as well as the real name.  
*The **nickname** for the U S Constitution is Old Ironsides.*

**pseudonym** A fictitious name used when the person performs a particular social role.  
*I wrote under the **pseudonym** of Evelyn Hervey.*

A person's nickname.  
**sobriquet** *She was a vast and haughty person who answered to the **sobriquet** Duchesse.*

## Alias as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Alias" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "alias" as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Used to indicate that a named person is also known or more familiar under another specified name.*
- *As known or named at another time or place.*

### Synonyms of "Alias" as an adverb (5 Words)

**a.k.a.** As known or named at another time or place.  
**also called** In addition.  
**also known as** In addition.  
**otherwise** In a different way.  
*She thought **otherwise**.*  
**otherwise known as** In other respects or ways.

- *Eric Blair, alias George Orwell.*

## Associations of "Alias" (30 Words)

<b>alphabetically</b>	In alphabetical order. <i>Books are now arranged <b>alphabetically</b> by author.</i>
<b>cognomen</b>	The name used to identify the members of a family (as distinguished from each member's given name).
<b>criminal</b>	Bringing or deserving severe rebuke or censure. <i>They are charged with conspiracy to commit <b>criminal</b> damage.</i>
<b>crook</b>	A long staff with one end being hook shaped. <i>Some pretty <b>crook</b> things went on there.</i>
<b>dub</b>	The new sounds added by dubbing. <i>Prewaxed thread has dramatically eased the process of <b>dubbing</b>.</i>
<b><u>epithet</u></b>	An epithet used as a term of abuse. <i>People jeered and hurled racial <b>epithets</b>.</i>
<b>factitious</b>	Not produced by natural forces. <i>A largely <b>factitious</b> national identity.</i>
<b>fake</b>	Not genuine; imitation or counterfeit. <i>He <b>faked</b> the signature.</i>
<b><u>faux</u></b>	Not genuine or real; being an imitation of the genuine article. <i>Their <b>faux</b> concern for the well being of the voters didn't fool many.</i>
<b>feigned</b>	Not genuine. <i>Her eyes widened with <b>feigned</b> shock.</i>
<b>felon</b>	A person who has committed a felony. <i>The <b>felon</b> undermining hand of dark corruption.</i>
<b>fraud</b>	A person who makes deceitful pretenses. <i>He was convicted of <b>fraud</b>.</i>
<b>given</b>	(of a document) signed and dated. <i>At a couture house attentive service is a <b>given</b>.</i>
<b>illegal</b>	Prohibited by law or by official or accepted rules. <i>An <b>illegal</b> chess move.</i>

<b>illegality</b>	The state of being contrary to or forbidden by law, especially criminal law. <i>Proceedings will be required to establish the <b>illegality</b> of the act.</i>
<b>incognito</b>	With your identity concealed. <i>She is locked in her <b>incognito</b>.</i>
<b>malefactor</b>	A person who commits a crime or some other wrong.
<b><u>moniker</u></b>	A familiar name for a person (often a shortened version of a person's given name). <i>His real <b>moniker</b> is Dave Kennedy.</i>
<b><u>name</u></b>	Of the Speaker mention a Member of Parliament by name as disobedient to the chair and thereby subject to a ban from the House. <i>They studied all the great <b>names</b> in the history of France.</i>
<b>patronymic</b>	Of or derived from a personal or family name. <i>A <b>patronymic</b> derived from the name of their original lordship.</i>
<b><u>perpetrate</u></b>	Perform an act, usually with a negative connotation. <i><b>Perpetrate</b> a crime.</i>
<b>phony</b>	A person who professes beliefs and opinions that he or she does not hold in order to conceal his or her real feelings or motives.
<b><u>pseudonym</u></b>	A fictitious name used when the person performs a particular social role. <i>I wrote under the <b>pseudonym</b> of Evelyn Hervey.</i>
<b>rob</b>	Take something away by force or without the consent of the owner. <i>Someone had <b>robbed</b> my jacket.</i>
<b>simulated</b>	Not genuine or real; being an imitation of the genuine article. <i>She howled in <b>simulated</b> anguish.</i>
<b>sobriquet</b>	A person's nickname. <i>She was a vast and haughty person who answered to the <b>sobriquet</b> Duchesse.</i>
<b>spurious</b>	Born out of wedlock. <i>A <b>spurious</b> work of art.</i>
<b>surname</b>	Give a surname to. <i>Simeon of the pillar by <b>surname</b> Stylites.</i>
<b>unlawful</b>	Having no legally established claim. <i><b>Unlawful</b> love.</i>
