- *(astronomy) apparent meeting or passing of two or more celestial bodies in the same degree of the zodiac.*
- *A linear arrangement of stones.*
- *An organization of people (or countries) involved in a pact or treaty.*
- *Apparent meeting or passing of two or more celestial bodies in the same degree of the zodiac.*
- *A position of agreement or alliance.*
- *The spatial property possessed by an arrangement or position of things in a straight line or in parallel lines.*

bloc	A group of countries or political parties with common interests who have formed an alliance. <i>A parliamentary bloc.</i>
caucus	A closed political meeting. <i>He stumbled through the Iowa caucuses and the New Hampshire primary.</i>
coalition	The state of being combined into one body. <i>A coalition between Liberals and Conservatives.</i>
conjunction	The grammatical relation between linguistic units words or phrases or clauses that are connected by a conjunction. <i>He postulated that the Americas were formed by the conjunction of floating islands.</i>
design	The art or action of conceiving of and producing a plan or drawing of something before it is made. <i>It was an excellent design for living.</i>
disposition	An inclination or tendency. <i>The Prime Minister has shown a disposition to alter policies.</i>
geography	Study of the earth's surface; includes people's responses to topography and climate and soil and vegetation. <i>The geography of post war London.</i>
grouping	Two or more atoms bound together as a single unit and forming part of a molecule. <i>The grouping of pupils by overall aptitude.</i>
layout	The way in which the parts of something are arranged or laid out. <i>Doing layout for newspapers and magazines.</i>
order	An institution founded by a monarch along the lines of a medieval crusading monastic order for the purpose of honouring meritorious conduct. <i>I gave the waiter my order.</i>
ordering	The act of putting things in a sequential arrangement. <i>There were mistakes in the ordering of items on the list.</i>
organization	The act of organizing a business or an activity related to a business. <i>The organization of conferences.</i>
partnership	A cooperative relationship between people or groups who agree to share responsibility for achieving some specific goal. <i>Effective language learning is a partnership between school teacher and student.</i>
positioning	The arrangement of the body and its limbs.
presentation	A visual representation of something. <i>The presentation of new data.</i>

ranging

An area in which something acts or operates or has power or control.

sorting

Grouping by class or kind or size.

*The bottleneck in mail delivery is the process of **sorting**.*

union

The operation of forming a union.

*God bless this **union**.*

aligned	In a straight line. <i>Pearly teeth evenly aligned.</i>
applicable	Relevant or appropriate. <i>Gave applicable examples to support her argument.</i>
appropriate	Suitable or proper in the circumstances. <i>A book not appropriate for children.</i>
correct	Make right or correct. <i>He had assumed she was married and she had not corrected him.</i>
correctly	In an accurate manner. <i>She had acted correctly.</i>
correspond	Be compatible, similar or consistent; coincide in their characteristics. <i>The carved heads described in the poem correspond to a drawing of Edgcote House.</i>
decent	Decently clothed. <i>A decent clean living individual.</i>
exact	(of ideas, images, representations, expressions) characterized by perfect conformity to fact or truth; strictly correct. <i>He exacts a cruel revenge against the winning candidate.</i>
exactitude	The quality of being precise or accurate. <i>He writes with exactitude and precision.</i>
exactly	In exact terms; without vagueness. <i>They met in 1989 and got married exactly two years later.</i>
fit	The manner in which something fits. <i>Most tools can be fitted with a new handle.</i>
horizontally	In a horizontal position or direction. <i>Labels are placed horizontally on the cases.</i>
just	Of an opinion or appraisal well founded justifiable. <i>A kind and just man.</i>
lineation	A line or linear marking; an arrangement or group of lines. <i>The punctuation and lineation are reproduced accurately.</i>
oriented	Adjusted or located in relation to surroundings or circumstances; sometimes used in combination. <i>The book is value oriented throughout.</i>
parallel	Two parallel lines as a reference mark. <i>She draws a parallel between personal destiny and social forces.</i>
precise	Used to emphasize that one is referring to an exact and particular thing. <i>The director was precise with his camera positions.</i>

precisely	Exactly (used to emphasize the complete accuracy or truth of a statement. <i>She always expressed herself precisely.</i>
proper	Thoroughly. <i>To judge with my proper eyes.</i>
properly	With reason or justice. <i>If you don't behave properly you'll have to leave.</i>
propriety	The condition of being right, appropriate, or fitting. <i>He always behaved with the utmost propriety.</i>
relevant	Having a bearing on or connection with the subject at issue. <i>The candidate's experience is relevant to the job.</i>
right	A person's right fist especially a boxer's. <i>The right answer.</i>
straight	A straight segment of a roadway or racecourse. <i>A long straight road.</i>
suitable	Meant or adapted for an occasion or use. <i>A tractor suitable or fit for heavy duty.</i>
veracious	Precisely accurate. <i>A veracious account.</i>
verbatim	Using exactly the same words. <i>Your quotations must be verbatim.</i>
vertically	In a way that involves different levels or stages of a hierarchy or process. <i>Vertically stacked books.</i>
