I think they re asleep **anyhow** they re quiet.

**collectively** In conjunction with; combined. The audience **collectively** winced.

Perfect and complete in every respect having all necessary qualities.

complete A complete meal.

To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (`whole' is often used

**completely** informally for `wholly.

Was **completely** at fault.

Constituting the undiminished entirety lacking nothing essential especially

**entire** not damaged Bacon.

My plans are to travel the **entire** world.

entirely Without any others being included or involved.

We have an **entirely** different outlook.

entirety

The state of being total and complete.

He read the article in its **entirety**.

**ever** At all times all the time and on every occasion.

Why **ever** did you do it.

Each and all of the members of a group considered singly and without

**every** exception.

Had every hope of success.



**everywhere** To or in any or all places.

You find fast food stores **everywhere**.

To the greatest degree or extent; completely or entirely; (`full' in this sense is

**fully** used as a combining form.

He didn t fully understand.

The lowest note in the gamut scale.

The orchestral **gamut**.

**generic** Relating to a genus.

Substituting **generic**s for brand name drugs.

**incessantly** Without interruption; constantly. *She talked about him incessantly.* 

Lasting or remaining in a particular state throughout a person's life.

A **lifelong** Conservative.

outright Without restrictions or stipulations or further payments.

An **outright** refusal.

**penetrable** Admitting of penetration or passage into or through.

The outer membrane is **penetrable**.

**perfectly** Completely and without qualification; used informally as intensifiers.

**Perfectly** clean glass bottles.

without any others being included or involved. Did it **solely** for money.

stark Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers.

The ridge formed a **stark** silhouette against the sky.

thoroughly Completely and absolutely good is sometimes used informally for thoroughly.

She was soon **thoroughly** bored.

total Add up in number or quantity.

A **total** failure.

totally Completely; absolutely.

They came from **totally** different backgrounds.

unsuited Not right or appropriate.

He was totally **unsuited** for the job.

utterly Completely and without qualification; used informally as intensifiers.

He looked **utterly** ridiculous.

whole Acting together as a single undiversified whole.

Whole in mind and body.



**wholly** 

To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent whole is often used informally for wholly.

The distinction is not **wholly** clear.
