locate	Assign a location to. Engineers were working to locate the fault.
location	A workplace away from a studio at which some or all of a movie may be made. The location of new housing beyond the existing built up areas.
nowhere	Having no prospect of progress or success. The constable was nowhere to be seen.
outdistance	Leave (a competitor or pursuer) far behind. <i>He outdistanced the other runners.</i>
outdo	Be or do something to a greater degree. The men tried to outdo each other in their generosity.



outpace	Go, rise, or improve faster than. Import growth outpace d export growth in the second quarter.
outstrip	Go far ahead of. Supply far outstrip ped demand.
overreach	An injury to a forefoot of a horse resulting from its having overreached. The horse overreach ed jumping the first hurdle.
overstep	Be superior or better than some standard. You must not overstep your borrowing limit.
<u>plethora</u>	An excess of a bodily fluid, particularly blood. A plethora of committees and subcommittees.
redundance	The attribute of being superfluous and unneeded.
roomy	Having ample space. The cabin is roomy and well planned.
somewhere	In or at or to some place someplace is used informally for somewhere. <i>They moved to somewhere in Spain.</i>
<u>spare</u>	Kept in reserve especially for emergency use. Few people had spare cash for inessentials.
superabundance	A quantity that is more than what is appropriate.
<u>surpass</u>	Be or do something to a greater degree. One line of soldiers surpass ed the other.
<u>there</u>	In that matter. There s a restaurant round the corner.
transcend	Surpass (a person or achievement. This was an issue transcend ing party politics.
<u>transgress</u>	(of the sea) spread over (an area of land. The sea transgress es along the West coast of the island.
ubiquitous	Present, appearing, or found everywhere. Cowboy hats are ubiquitous among the male singers.
ubiquity	The fact of appearing everywhere or of being very common. <i>The growing ubiquity of advertising</i> .
whatever	No matter what happens. Give me whatever peaches you don t want.
