entirety	The state of being total and complete. <i>He read the article in its entirety.</i>
every	Each and all of a series of entities or intervals as specified. <i>Every party is welcome.</i>
everywhere	Common or widely distributed. <i>I ve looked everywhere.</i>
exceed	Be better than; surpass. <i>Production costs have exceeded 60 000.</i>
gamut	The lowest note in the gamut scale. <i>A face that expressed a gamut of emotions.</i>
in	Expressing the situation of being enclosed or surrounded by something. <i>Large shoulder pads are in.</i>
locate	Assign a location to. <i>Engineers were working to locate the fault.</i>
location	A workplace away from a studio at which some or all of a movie may be made. <i>The location of new housing beyond the existing built up areas.</i>
nowhere	Having no prospect of progress or success. <i>The constable was nowhere to be seen.</i>
outdistance	Leave (a competitor or pursuer) far behind. <i>He outdistanced the other runners.</i>
outdo	Be or do something to a greater degree. <i>The men tried to outdo each other in their generosity.</i>

outpace	Go, rise, or improve faster than. <i>Import growth outpaced export growth in the second quarter.</i>
outstrip	Go far ahead of. <i>Supply far outstripped demand.</i>
overreach	An injury to a forefoot of a horse resulting from its having overreached. <i>The horse overreached jumping the first hurdle.</i>
overstep	Be superior or better than some standard. <i>You must not overstep your borrowing limit.</i>
plethora	An excess of a bodily fluid, particularly blood. <i>A plethora of committees and subcommittees.</i>
redundance	The attribute of being superfluous and unneeded.
roomy	Having ample space. <i>The cabin is roomy and well planned.</i>
somewhere	In or at or to some place someplace is used informally for somewhere. <i>They moved to somewhere in Spain.</i>
spare	Kept in reserve especially for emergency use. <i>Few people had spare cash for inessentials.</i>
superabundance	A quantity that is more than what is appropriate.
surpass	Be or do something to a greater degree. <i>One line of soldiers surpassed the other.</i>
there	In that matter. <i>There s a restaurant round the corner.</i>
transcend	Surpass (a person or achievement). <i>This was an issue transcending party politics.</i>
transgress	(of the sea) spread over (an area of land). <i>The sea transgresses along the West coast of the island.</i>
ubiquitous	Present, appearing, or found everywhere. <i>Cowboy hats are ubiquitous among the male singers.</i>
ubiquity	The fact of appearing everywhere or of being very common. <i>The growing ubiquity of advertising.</i>
whatever	No matter what happens. <i>Give me whatever peaches you don t want.</i>
