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## Associations of "All the time" (30 Words)

<b>almanac</b>	An annual publication including weather forecasts and other miscellaneous information arranged according to the calendar of a given year.
<b>always</b>	At any time or in any event. <i>Isabel had <b>always</b> been in rude health.</i>
<b>annually</b>	Without missing a year. <i>Sales are increasing by about 17 <b>annually</b>.</i>
<b><u>calendar</u></b>	Enter into a calendar. <i>It was at their discretion whether to index or <b>calendar</b> the records.</i>
<b>consecutively</b>	In unbroken or logical sequence. <i>Jeremy smoked four cigarettes <b>consecutively</b>.</i>
<b><u>daily</u></b>	Gradually and progressively. <i>Boats can be hired for a <b>daily</b> rate.</i>
<b>day-to-day</b>	The period of time taken by a particular planet (e.g. Mars) to make a complete rotation on its axis.
<b><u>every</u></b>	Each and all of the members of a group considered singly and without exception. <i><b>Every</b> party is welcome.</i>
<b><u>frequent</u></b>	Be a regular or frequent visitor to a certain place. <i>Walls flanked by <b>frequent</b> square towers.</i>
<b><u>frequently</u></b>	Regularly or habitually; often. <i>They go abroad <b>frequently</b>.</i>
<b>intermittently</b>	In an intermittent manner. <i>An <b>intermittently</b> amusing plot.</i>
<b>occasional</b>	Occurring or appearing at usually irregular intervals. <i>An <b>occasional</b> worker.</i>

<b><u>occasionally</u></b>	Now and then or here and there. <i>We met up <b>occasionally</b> for a drink.</i>
<b>oft</b>	Many times at short intervals. <i>An <b>oft</b> quoted tenet.</i>
<b>often</b>	Frequently or in great quantities. <i>He <b>often</b> goes for long walks by himself.</i>
<b>oftentimes</b>	In many instances. <i>I would <b>oftentimes</b> go there.</i>
<b>period</b>	A set of elements occupying a horizontal row in the periodic table. <i>The <b>period</b> 1977 85.</i>
<b><u>periodic</u></b>	Relating to the periodic table of the elements. <i>The <b>periodic</b> appearance of the seventeen year locust.</i>
<b>periodical</b>	A magazine or newspaper published at regular intervals. <i>Britain's best <b>periodical</b> art magazine.</i>
<b>periodically</b>	At regularly occurring intervals. <i>The students received help from a friend only <b>periodically</b>.</i>
<b>punctuality</b>	The fact or quality of being on time. <i>He was a stickler for <b>punctuality</b>.</i>
<b>regular</b>	Relating to a person who does something regularly. <i>The <b>regular</b> clergy.</i>
<b>regularity</b>	A property of polygons: the property of having equal sides and equal angles. <i>He came to see her with increasing <b>regularity</b>.</i>
<b><u>regularly</u></b>	In a regular way without variation. <i>Leaves arranged <b>regularly</b> along the stem.</i>
<b>simultaneously</b>	At the same time. <i>They spoke <b>simultaneously</b>.</i>
<b><u>sometimes</u></b>	Occasionally, rather than all of the time. <i><b>Sometimes</b> I want to do things on my own.</i>
<b>successively</b>	Immediately one after another. <i>Three letters of <b>successively</b> decreasing length.</i>
<b>twice</b>	Double in degree or quantity. <i>I'm <b>twice</b> your age.</i>
<b><u>weekly</u></b>	Once a week. <i>She visited her aunt <b>weekly</b>.</i>

**year**

The period of 365 days or 366 days in leap years starting from the first of January used for reckoning time in ordinary circumstances.
