## Associations of "All the while" (30 Words)

<b>absolutely</b>	With no qualification, restriction, or limitation; totally. <i>White collar crime increased both <b>absolutely</b> and in comparison with other categories.</i>
<b>altogether</b>	Taking everything into consideration; on the whole. <i>An <b>altogether</b> new approach.</i>
<b>always</b>	As a last resort; failing all else. <i><b>Always</b> arrives on time.</i>
<b>anyhow</b>	In a careless or haphazard way. <i>I think they re asleep <b>anyhow</b> they re quiet.</i>
<b>collectively</b>	As a group; as a whole. <i>The vast range of resources that the American people <b>collectively</b> own.</i>
<b>complete</b>	Complete a pass. <i>A <b>complete</b> gentleman.</i>
<b>completely</b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly’). <i>Was <b>completely</b> at fault.</i>
<b>entire</b>	Constituting the undiminished entirety lacking nothing essential especially not damaged. <i>Was able to keep the collection <b>entire</b> during his lifetime.</i>
<b>entirely</b>	Solely. <i>The traffic seemed to consist <b>entirely</b> of black cabs.</i>
<b>entirety</b>	The state of being total and complete. <i>He read the article in its <b>entirety</b>.</i>
<b>ever</b>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Don t you <b>ever</b> regret giving up all that money.</i>
<b>every</b>	Each and all of a series of entities or intervals as specified. <i><b>Every</b> person is mortal.</i>

- everywhere** To or in any or all places.  
*Sandwich bars are **everywhere**.*
- frequently** Regularly or habitually; often.  
*They go abroad **frequently**.*
- fully** Completely or entirely; to the fullest extent.  
*They were **fully** or amply fed.*
- gamut** The lowest note in the gamut scale.  
*A face that expressed a **gamut** of emotions.*
- generic** Wine that does not meet the minimum qualifications and standards for use of a designation by appellation of origin (where the grapes are grown) or by varietal content; may only be labeled by proprietary (made-up) name, by general color (such as `vin rouge`, `vino rosso`, `rotwein`, `red wine`, etc.), or by general class (as `vin ordinaire`, `vin de table`, `vino da tavola`, `tafelwein`, `table wine`, etc.).  
***Generic** dance floor fillers.*
- incessantly** Without interruption.  
*She talked about him **incessantly**.*
- lifelong** Continuing through life.  
*From **lifelong** habit.*
- outright** Immediately or instantly.  
*He was killed **outright**.*
- perfectly** Used for emphasis, especially in order to assert something that has been challenged or doubted.  
*The ring fitted **perfectly**.*
- solely** Not involving anyone or anything else; only.  
*Did it **solely** for money.*
- stark** Completely.  
***Stark** staring mad.*
- thoroughly** Completely and absolutely good is sometimes used informally for thoroughly.  
*We searched the files **thoroughly**.*
- total** Comprising the whole number or amount.  
*A **total** disaster.*
- totally** To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (`whole` is often used informally for `wholly`.  
*A **totally** new situation.*
- unsuited** Not easy to combine harmoniously.  
*He was totally **unsuited** for the job.*

**utterly** Completely and without qualification; absolutely.  
***Utterly** miserable.*

**whole** Acting together as a single undiversified whole.  
*A **whole** person again.*

**wholly** To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent whole is often used informally for wholly.  
*He was **wholly** convinced.*
