- *A mixture containing two or more metallic elements or metallic and nonmetallic elements usually fused together or dissolving into each other when molten.*
- *An inferior metal mixed with a precious one.*
- *A metal made by combining two or more metallic elements, especially to give greater strength or resistance to corrosion.*
- *The state of impairing the quality or reducing the value of something.*

- compound** A whole formed by a union of two or more elements or parts.
*Lead **compounds**.*
- fusion** The combining of images from the two eyes to form a single visual percept.
*The election results produced pressure for **fusion** of the parties.*
- meld** A thing formed by melding a combination.
*A **meld** of many contributions.*
- metal** Heavy metal or similar rock music.
*Industrial music is a blend of **metal** and techno.*
- mix** A commercially prepared mixture of ingredients for making a particular type of food or a product such as concrete.
*Arriving at the correct **mix** of full time to part time staff.*
- mixture** An event that combines things in a mixture.
*Shandy is a **mixture** of beer and lemonade.*
- union** The operation of forming a union.
*There is strength in **union**.*

amalgamate	Alloy (a metal) with mercury. <i>He amalgamated his company with another.</i>
blend	Blend or harmonize. <i>Blend the cornflour with a tablespoon of water.</i>
combine	Combine so as to form a whole mix. <i>These forces combined with others.</i>
<u>compound</u>	Reckon (interest) on previously accumulated interest. <i>A dialect compounded of Spanish and Dutch.</i>
debase	Corrupt debase or make impure by adding a foreign or inferior substance often by replacing valuable ingredients with inferior ones. <i>The love episodes debase the dignity of the drama.</i>
<u>fuse</u>	Cause an electrical appliance to stop working when a fuse melts. <i>There is no need to fuse the circuit any higher unless there is other equipment on the same circuit.</i>

- intermingle** Mix or mingle together.
*Daisies **intermingled** with huge expanses of gorse and foxgloves.*
- intermix** Combine into one.
*The ore had to be handled so that it was not inadvertently **intermixed** with other material.*
- meld** Announce for a score; of cards in a card game.
*Australia s winemakers have **melded** modern science with traditional art.*
- mix** Mix together different elements.
*It was everyone s dream to **mix** their album in their front room.*
- unite** Act in concert or unite in a common purpose or belief.
*He called on the party to **unite**.*

- *A salutary fear alloyed their admiration.*

braze	A brazed joint. <i>The company adapted its process to braze the flute components under vacuum.</i>
bronze	A sculpture made of bronze. <i>Bronze baby shoes.</i>
commingle	Mix; blend. <i>His book commingles sarcasm and sadness.</i>
<u>conflate</u>	Combine (two or more sets of information, texts, ideas, etc.) into one. <i>The urban crisis conflates a number of different economic political and social issues.</i>
<u>gold</u>	Made of or coloured like gold. <i>She has a heart of gold.</i>
intermix	Mix together. <i>Along its southern edge low trees intermix with the shrubs.</i>
ion	An atom or molecule with a net electric charge due to the loss or gain of one or more electrons. <i>A sulphate ion.</i>
lead	Lead extend or afford access. <i>The team held a slender one goal lead.</i>
liquefy	Become liquid. <i>The minimum pressure required to liquefy a gas.</i>
lithium	Lithium carbonate or another lithium salt used as a mood stabilizing drug.
manganese	The black dioxide of manganese as an industrial raw material or additive especially in glass making.
<u>meld</u>	A thing formed by melding a combination. <i>Australia s winemakers have melded modern science with traditional art.</i>
<u>melt</u>	A sandwich hamburger or other dish containing or topped with melted cheese. <i>The ice cream melted.</i>
<u>metal</u>	Heavy metal or similar rock music. <i>Metallic luster.</i>

metallic	A paint fabric or colour with a metallic sheen. <i>The strange metallic note of the meadow lark suggesting the clash of vibrant blades.</i>
<u>mingle</u>	Mix or cause to mix together. <i>Resourcefully he mingled music and dance.</i>
mix	A version of a recording in which the component tracks are mixed in a different way from the original. <i>The mixing of sound channels in the recording studio.</i>
<u>mixture</u>	An event that combines things in a mixture. <i>He drank a mixture of beer and lemonade.</i>
oxide	A binary compound of oxygen with another element or group. <i>Nitrogen oxide.</i>
<u>rust</u>	Any of various fungi causing rust disease in plants. <i>The pipes rusted.</i>
solder	Join or fuse with solder. <i>The Roman silversmith did indeed use several different solders.</i>
solidification	The process of becoming hard or solid by cooling or drying or crystallization.
weld	A welded joint. <i>Her gratitude welded her to him.</i>
welding	Fastening two pieces of metal together by softening with heat and applying pressure.
zinc	A bluish white lustrous metallic element brittle at ordinary temperatures but malleable when heated used in a wide variety of alloys and in galvanizing iron it occurs naturally as zinc sulphide in zinc blende. <i>A zinc roof.</i>
