| advert | An advertisement. |
| aforsaid | Being the one previously mentioned or spoken of. |
| <u>allusion</u> | The practice of making allusions. <i>An allusion to Shakespeare.</i> |
| <u>attend</u> | To accompany as a circumstance or follow as a result. <i>She attends class regularly.</i> |
| <u>cite</u> | Refer to. <i>He was cited for his outstanding achievements.</i> |
| connote | (of a fact) imply as a consequence or condition. <i>Spinsterhood connoted failure.</i> |
| cue | Give a cue to or for. <i>There was a pause while she cued up the next tape.</i> |
| <u>denote</u> | Be a sign of; indicate. <i>This mark denotes purity and quality.</i> |
| describe | Identify as in botany or biology, for example. <i>On the diameter of a circle an equilateral triangle is described.</i> |
| description | A statement that represents something in words. <i>People who had seen him were able to give a description.</i> |
| explain | Make plain and comprehensible. <i>I explained about Maureen calling round.</i> |
| express | Give expression to. <i>He expressed complete satisfaction.</i> |
| <u>foregoing</u> | Just mentioned or stated; preceding. <i>The foregoing analysis of the economic class structure.</i> |
| hint | Drop a hint intimate by a hint. <i>A hint mockery in her manner.</i> |

| <u>implicit</u> | Being without doubt or reserve. <i>The oak is implicit in the acorn.</i> |
| <u>imply</u> | Suggest that someone is guilty. <i>Salesmen who use jargon to imply superior knowledge.</i> |
| indicate | Indicate a place direction person or thing either spatially or figuratively. <i>Indicated his wishes in a letter.</i> |
| <u>insinuate</u> | Introduce or insert (oneself) in a subtle manner. <i>He insinuated himself into the conversation of the people at the nearby table.</i> |
| mean | Mean or intend to express or convey. <i>I only meant to help you.</i> |
| mention | An instance of being mentioned in dispatches. <i>He received a special mention and a prize of 100.</i> |
| note | A written sign representing the pitch and duration of a musical note. <i>He detected a note of sarcasm.</i> |
| overtone | (usually plural) an ulterior implicit meaning or quality. <i>Overtones of despair.</i> |
| <u>quote</u> | Put quote marks around. <i>Quotes from different insurance companies.</i> |
| <u>refer</u> | Make reference to. <i>I always refer to a dictionary when I come upon a new word.</i> |
| remark | A statement that expresses a personal opinion or belief or adds information. <i>The landscape familiar since childhood was not worthy of remark.</i> |
| saying | A short, pithy, commonly known expression which generally offers advice or wisdom. <i>This is stated in the sayings of the Prophet.</i> |
| <u>signify</u> | Be of importance. <i>The locked door doesn't necessarily signify.</i> |
| story | A plot or storyline. <i>During police interviews Harper changed his story.</i> |
| tell | A Swiss patriot who lived in the early 14th century and who was renowned for his skill as an archer; according to legend an Austrian governor compelled him to shoot an apple from his son's head with his crossbow (which he did successfully without mishap). <i>The figures tell a different story.</i> |
| <u>unknowingly</u> | Without knowledge or intention. <i>Every day we are unknowingly exposed to a variety of pesticides.</i> |
