- Using or containing suggestion rather than explicit mention.
- Characterized by indirect references.

<u>implicit</u>	Being without doubt or reserve. An implicit agreement not to raise the subject.
<u>imply</u>	Express or state indirectly. Salesmen who use jargon to imply superior knowledge.



indicate	Indicate a place direction person or thing either spatially or figuratively. <i>One car had indicated left but pulled out in front of him.</i>
<u>insinuate</u>	Introduce or insert (oneself) in a subtle manner. I insinuate d that I did not like his wife.
mean	Mean or intend to express or convey. I don t know what you mean .
mention	An instance of being mentioned in dispatches. Their eyes light up at a mention of Sartre.
note	A banknote. You need a sick note from your doctor.
overtone	A subtle or subsidiary quality, implication, or connotation. <i>Overtones of despair.</i>
<u>quote</u>	Put quote marks around. <i>He quoted the Bible to her.</i>
<u>refer</u>	Make reference to. I always refer to a dictionary when I come upon a new word.
remark	Regard with attention; notice. Tom s looking peaky she remark ed.
saying	A word or phrase that particular people use in particular situations. <i>This is stated in the sayings of the Prophet.</i>
<u>signify</u>	(among black Americans) exchange boasts or insults as a game or ritual. The church used this image to signify the Holy Trinity.
story	A plot or storyline. The story was on the 11 o clock news.
tell	Narrate or give a detailed account of. Tell me what is bothering you.
<u>unknowingly</u>	Without knowledge or intention. Every day we are unknowingly exposed to a variety of pesticides.
