Reality can be approximated by computational techniques.

approximately (of quantities) imprecise but fairly close to correct.

ately A journey of **approximately** two hours.



around All around or on all sides.

The mountains towering all **around**.

broadly In general and without considering minor details.

Broadly speaking the risks are as follows.

equidistant At equal distances.
