Dirty clothes lying around or about.

Located close together.

approximate

Reality can be approximated by computational techniques.

**approximately** (of quantities) imprecise but fairly close to correct.

**ately** A journey of **approximately** two hours.



**around** All around or on all sides.

The mountains towering all **around**.

broadly In general and without considering minor details.

**Broadly** speaking the risks are as follows.

**equidistant** At equal distances.

The line joins together all points which are **equidistant** from the two axes.

Each and all of a series of entities or intervals as specified.

Had every hope of success.

The minority of people; the elect.
