## Alright as an Adverb

### Definitions of "Alright" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “alright” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *In a satisfactory or adequate manner.*
- *In a satisfactory or adequate manner; (‘alright’ is a nonstandard variant of ‘all right’.*
- *An expression of agreement normally occurring at the beginning of a sentence.*
- *Without doubt (used to reinforce an assertion.*

### Synonyms of "Alright" as an adverb (6 Words)

<b>all right</b>	To a complete degree or to the full or entire extent (‘whole’ is often used informally for ‘wholly’.
<b>fine</b>	In a delicate manner. <i>Her <b>fine</b> drawn body.</i>
<b>o.k.</b>	In a satisfactory or adequate manner; (‘alright’ is a nonstandard variant of ‘all right’.
<b>ok</b>	An expression of agreement normally occurring at the beginning of a sentence.
<b>okay</b>	In a satisfactory or adequate manner. <i>She ll do <b>okay</b> on her own.</i>
<b>very well</b>	Used as intensifiers; ‘real’ is sometimes used informally for ‘really’; ‘rattling’ is informal.

## Associations of "Alright" (30 Words)

<b>adequate</b>	Sufficient for the purpose. <i>She was <b>adequate</b> to the job.</i>
<b>allow</b>	Allow the other baseball team to score. <i>The river was patrolled and few people were <b>allowed</b> across.</i>
<b>answer</b>	Give the correct answer or solution to. <i>She <b>answered</b> that she would take nothing but the ring.</i>
<b>approve</b>	Give sanction to. <i>He <b>approved</b> himself ripe for military command.</i>
<b>clap</b>	Show approval of a person or action by clapping. <i>When the <b>clapping</b> had died down he stood up to make a speech.</i>
<b><u>complacent</u></b>	Contented to a fault with oneself or one's actions. <i>You can't afford to be <b>complacent</b> about security.</i>
<b><u>consent</u></b>	Give an affirmative reply to; respond favorably to. <i>He <b>consented</b> to a search by a detective.</i>
<b>contented</b>	Satisfied or showing satisfaction with things as they are. <i>I was never <b>contented</b> with half measures.</i>
<b><u>exclaim</u></b>	Utter aloud; often with surprise, horror, or joy. <i>She looked in the mirror <b>exclaiming</b> in dismay at her appearance.</i>
<b>fine</b>	Characterized by elegance or refinement or accomplishment. <i>The soils were all <b>fine</b> silt.</i>
<b>good</b>	Often used as a combining form in a good or proper or satisfactory manner or to a high standard good is a nonstandard dialectal variant for well. <i>A mysterious balance of <b>good</b> and evil.</i>
<b><u>greet</u></b>	Send greetings to. <i>Sam threw open the door and was <b>greeted</b> by a cacophony of noise.</i>
<b>hi</b>	An expression of greeting.
<b>indulgence</b>	In the Roman Catholic Church a grant by the Pope of remission of the temporal punishment in purgatory still due for sins after absolution The unrestricted sale of indulgences by pardoners was a widespread abuse during the later Middle Ages. <i>Too much <b>indulgence</b> spoils a child.</i>
<b>indulging</b>	The act of indulging or gratifying a desire.
<b><u>nod</u></b>	Sway gently back and forth as in a nodding motion. <i>He looked around for support and everyone <b>noded</b>.</i>
<b>oh</b>	A midwestern state in north central United States in the Great Lakes region.

<b>okay</b>	In a satisfactory or adequate manner. <i>She ll do <b>okay</b> on her own.</i>
<b>passable</b>	Just good enough to be acceptable; satisfactory. <i>The road is <b>passable</b>.</i>
<b>permissible</b>	That may be accepted or conceded. <i>A <b>permissible</b> tax deduction.</i>
<b><u>pleased</u></b>	Feeling or showing pleasure and satisfaction, especially at an event or a situation. <i>A <b>pleased</b> smile.</i>
<b>reply</b>	A statement either spoken or written that is made to reply to a question or request or criticism or accusation. <i>I received a <b>reply</b> from the managing director.</i>
<b><u>satisfactory</u></b>	Giving satisfaction. <i>His grades were <b>satisfactory</b>.</i>
<b><u>satisfied</u></b>	Allayed. <i><b>Satisfied</b> customers.</i>
<b><u>sensuous</u></b>	Taking delight in beauty. <i>The work showed a deliberate disregard of the more <b>sensuous</b> and immediately appealing aspects of painting.</i>
<b><u>smug</u></b>	Having or showing an excessive pride in oneself or one's achievements. <i>He was feeling <b>smug</b> after his win.</i>
<b><u>tolerable</u></b>	Fairly good; mediocre. <i>The climate is at least <b>tolerable</b>.</i>
<b>wow</b>	A joke that seems extremely funny. <i>They <b>wowed</b> audiences on their recent British tour.</i>
<b>yeah</b>	Not only so, but.
<b><u>yes</u></b>	An affirmative. <i>Answering with assured and ardent <b>yeses</b>.</i>
