<b>distinguished</b>	Used of a person’s appearance or behavior; befitting an eminent person. <i>A <b>distinguished</b> American educationist.</i>
<b>eminent</b>	(of a positive quality) present to a notable degree. <i>The book s scholarship and <b>eminent</b> readability.</i>
<a href="#"><u>fame</u></a>	The state or quality of being widely honored and acclaimed. <i>The song s success rocketed him to stardom and <b>fame</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>famous</u></a>	Widely known and esteemed. <i>A <b>famous</b> actor.</i>
<b>formally</b>	In terms of form or structure. <i><b>Formally</b> complex types of text.</i>

<b>furthermore</b>	In addition; besides (used to introduce a fresh consideration in an argument. <i>Computer chess games are getting cheaper all the time <b>furthermore</b> their quality is improving.</i>
<b>honorary</b>	Of a person holding an honorary title or position. <i>An <b>honorary</b> degree.</i>
<b>identify</b>	Give the name or identifying characteristics of refer to by name or some other identifying characteristic property. <i>The men identified themselves as federal police.</i>
<b>like</b>	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>I responded in <b>like</b> manner.</i>
<b>likewise</b>	In the same way; also. <i>Some people have little power to do good and have <b>likewise</b> little strength to resist evil.</i>
<b>maybe</b>	A mere possibility or probability. <i>No ifs buts or <b>maybes</b>.</i>
<b>moreover</b>	As a further matter; besides. <i><b>Moreover</b> statistics show that competition for places is growing.</i>
<b>noted</b>	Well known; famous. <i>A <b>noted</b> patron of the arts.</i>
<b>person</b>	A category used in the classification of pronouns possessive determiners and verb forms according to whether they indicate the speaker first person the addressee second person or a third party third person. <i>I would have publicity photographs on my <b>person</b> at all times.</i>
<b>popular</b>	Liked or admired by many people or by a particular person or group. <i>The <b>popular</b> vote.</i>
<b>prescribed</b>	Set down as a rule or guide. <i>In <b>prescribed</b> order.</i>
<b>recognized</b>	Provided with a secure reputation. <i>His <b>recognized</b> superiority in this kind of work.</i>
<b>renowned</b>	Widely known and esteemed. <i>A <b>renowned</b> author.</i>
<b>reputation</b>	The state of being held in high esteem and honor. <i>His <b>reputation</b> was tarnished by allegations of bribery.</i>
<b>similar</b>	Resembling or similar having the same or some of the same characteristics often used in combination. <i>Northern India and <b>similar</b> areas.</i>
