<a href="#">centered</a>	Being or placed in the center.

<b>changed</b>	Changed in constitution or structure or composition by metamorphism. <i><b>Changed</b> styles of dress.</i>

<b>convert</b>	A person who has been converted to another religious or political belief. <i><b>Convert</b> slaves to laborers.</i>
<b>dramatically</b>	In a way intended to create an effect; theatrically. <i>She paused <b>dramatically</b>.</i>
<a href="#">egocentric</a>	An egocentric person. <i><b>Egocentric</b> spatial perception.</i>
<b>egocentrism</b>	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
<b>egoism</b>	Concern for your own interests and welfare.
<b>egoist</b>	A self-centered person with little regard for others.
<b>egotism</b>	An exaggerated opinion of your own importance. <i>In his arrogance and <b>egotism</b> he underestimated Gill.</i>
<b>egotist</b>	A conceited and self-centered person. <i>He is a self absorbed <b>egotist</b>.</i>
<b>individual</b>	Characteristic of or meant for a single person or thing. <i><b>Individual</b> tiny flowers.</i>
<b>individualist</b>	A person who pursues independent thought or action. <i><b>Individualist</b> attitudes.</i>
<a href="#">individualistic</a>	With minimally restricted freedom in commerce. <i><b>Individualistic</b> cultures where individuals strive for self realization.</i>

<b>metamorphose</b>	<i>The extreme heat <b>metamorphosed</b> the sandstone baking it white and producing a quartzite rock.</i>
	A mutant form.
<b>mutant</b>	<i>Frequently only a small percentage of the offspring of <b>mutants</b> resemble their parents.</i>
	The best state of something; the prime.
<b>pride</b>	<i>In the <b>pride</b> of youth.</i>
	Relating to of or by or to or from or for the self.
<b>self</b>	<i>An article with a picture of my good <b>self</b>.</i>
	Concerned chiefly or only with yourself and your advantage to the exclusion of others- Maria Weston Chapman.
<b>selfish</b>	<i>I joined them for <b>selfish</b> reasons.</i>
	The quality or state of being selfish; lack of consideration for other people.
<b>selfishness</b>	<i>An act of pure <b>selfishness</b>.</i>
	That part of the unconscious mind that acts as a conscience.
<b>superego</b>	<i>True schizophrenias lack the <b>superego</b> elements present in paranoia.</i>
	Elevate or idealize, in allusion to Christ's transfiguration.
<b>transfigure</b>	<i>The treatment and diet <b>transfigured</b> her into a beautiful young woman.</i>
	Subject to a mathematical transformation.
<b>transform</b>	<i>A wry cynicism rapidly <b>transforms</b> into an overwhelming sense of sourness.</i>
	A sudden dramatic change of scenery on stage.
<b>transformation</b>	<i>British society underwent a radical <b>transformation</b>.</i>
	Given a completely different form or appearance.
<b>transformed</b>	<i>Shocked to see the <b>transformed</b> landscape.</i>
	Change completely the nature or appearance of.
<b>transmogrify</b>	<i>His home was transmogrified into a hippy crash pad.</i>
	Low table with mirror or mirrors where one sits while dressing or applying makeup.
<b>vanity</b>	<i>It flattered his <b>vanity</b> to think I was in love with him.</i>
	Characterized by variety.
<b>varied</b>	<i><b>Varied</b> motives prompt people to join a political party.</i>
	Change from one condition, form, or state to another.
<b>vary</b>	<i>The properties <b>vary</b> in price.</i>
