### **Definitions of "Alters" as a verb**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “alters” as a verb can have the following definitions:


- *Insert words into texts, often falsifying it thereby.*
- *Cause to change; make different; cause a transformation.*
- *Make an alteration to.*
- *Become different in some particular way, without permanently losing one's or its former characteristics or essence.*
- *Remove the ovaries of.*



## Synonyms of "Alters" as a verb (8 Words)

**castrate** Remove the testicles of (a male animal or man).  
*A restrictive classicism would have **castrated** England's literature.*

- change** Exchange a sum of money for the same sum in a different currency or denomination.  
*The ferns began to **change** shape.*
- falsify** Insert words into texts often falsifying it thereby.  
***Falsify** the data.*
- interpolate** Insert words into texts, often falsifying it thereby.  
*I dare say **interpolated** her employer.*
- modify** Cause to change; make different; cause a transformation.  
*Please **modify** this letter to make it more polite.*
- neuter** Remove the ovaries of.  
*All pit bulls must be registered and **neutered**.*
- spay** Remove the ovaries of.  
*The animals must be **spayed** or neutered before they are given up for adoption.*
- vary** Be at variance with; be out of line with.  
*Prices **vary**.*



## Usage Examples of "Alters" as a verb

- *This dress needs to be altered.*
- *The advent of the automobile may have altered the growth pattern of the city.*



## Associations of "Alters" (30 Words)

### **adapt**

Adapt or conform oneself to new or different conditions.  
*Hospitals have had to be **adapted** for modern medical practice.*

### **adaptation**

The action or process of adapting or being adapted.  
*A three part **adaptation** of Hard Times.*

### **adaption**

The process of adapting to something (such as environmental conditions).

### **adjustment**

A small alteration or movement made to achieve a desired fit, appearance, or result.  
*Only slight **adjustments** to the boat are necessary.*

<b>change</b>	Undergo a change become different in essence losing one s or its original nature. <i>His voice began to <b>change</b> when he was 12 years old.</i>
<b>changed</b>	Changed in constitution or structure or composition by metamorphism. <i><b>Changed</b> styles of dress.</i>
<b>compatibility</b>	A feeling of sympathetic understanding. <i>He argues for the <b>compatibility</b> of science and religion.</i>
<b><u>conversion</u></b>	The transposition of the subject and predicate of a proposition according to certain rules to form a new proposition by inference. <i>His passion for seventeenth century literature had led the former atheist to a sudden <b>conversion</b>.</i>
<b>convert</b>	A person who has been converted to another religious or political belief. <i>He was <b>converted</b> in his later years to the socialist cause.</i>
<b>defection</b>	The state of having rejected your religious beliefs or your political party or a cause (often in favor of opposing beliefs or causes). <i>A number of <b>defections</b> by leading ballet dancers.</i>
<b>disabuse</b>	Free somebody (from an erroneous belief). <i>He quickly <b>disabused</b> me of my fanciful notions.</i>
<b>dramatically</b>	In an exciting or impressive manner. <i>My opponent s policies are <b>dramatically</b> different from ours.</i>
<b><u>edit</u></b>	A change or correction made as a result of editing. <i><b>Edit</b> film.</i>
<b><u>flux</u></b>	Treat a metal object with a flux to promote melting. <i>The newness and <b>flux</b> of the computer industry.</i>
<b>metamorphose</b>	(of an insect or amphibian) undergo metamorphosis, especially into the adult form. <i>The extreme heat <b>metamorphosed</b> the sandstone baking it white and producing a quartzite rock.</i>
<b><u>modification</u></b>	An event that occurs when something passes from one state or phase to another. <i>A number of <b>modifications</b> are being carried out to the engines.</i>
<b>modify</b>	Transform (a structure) from its original anatomical form during development or evolution. <i>Please <b>modify</b> this letter to make it more polite.</i>
<b><u>mutant</u></b>	A mutant form. <i>Frequently only a small percentage of the offspring of <b>mutants</b> resemble their parents.</i>
<b>proselyte</b>	A new convert; especially a gentile converted to Judaism.

<b>remold</b>	Cast again.
<b>retouch</b>	Give retouches to hair. <i>This photograph has been <b>retouched</b>.</i>
<b>transfigure</b>	Change completely the nature or appearance of. <i>Jesus was <b>transfigured</b> after his resurrection.</i>
<u><b>transform</b></u>	Change a mathematical entity by transformation. <i>A wry cynicism rapidly <b>transforms</b> into an overwhelming sense of sourness.</i>
<b>transformation</b>	A function that changes the position or direction of the axes of a coordinate system. <i>British society underwent a radical <b>transformation</b>.</i>
<b>transformed</b>	Given a completely different form or appearance. <i>Shocked to see the <b>transformed</b> landscape.</i>
<b>transmogrify</b>	Transform in a surprising or magical manner. <i>His home was transmogrified into a hippy crash pad.</i>
<u><b>transmute</b></u>	Change in form, nature, or substance. <i>The quest to <b>transmute</b> lead into gold.</i>
<u><b>variance</b></u>	An activity that varies from a norm or standard. <i>The stylistic <b>variances</b> of classical dance.</i>
<u><b>variant</b></u>	Exhibiting variation and change. <i>A <b>variant</b> of the same word.</i>
<u><b>vary</b></u>	Make something more diverse and varied. <i>The properties <b>vary</b> in price.</i>
