According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “amazement” as a noun can have the following definitions:

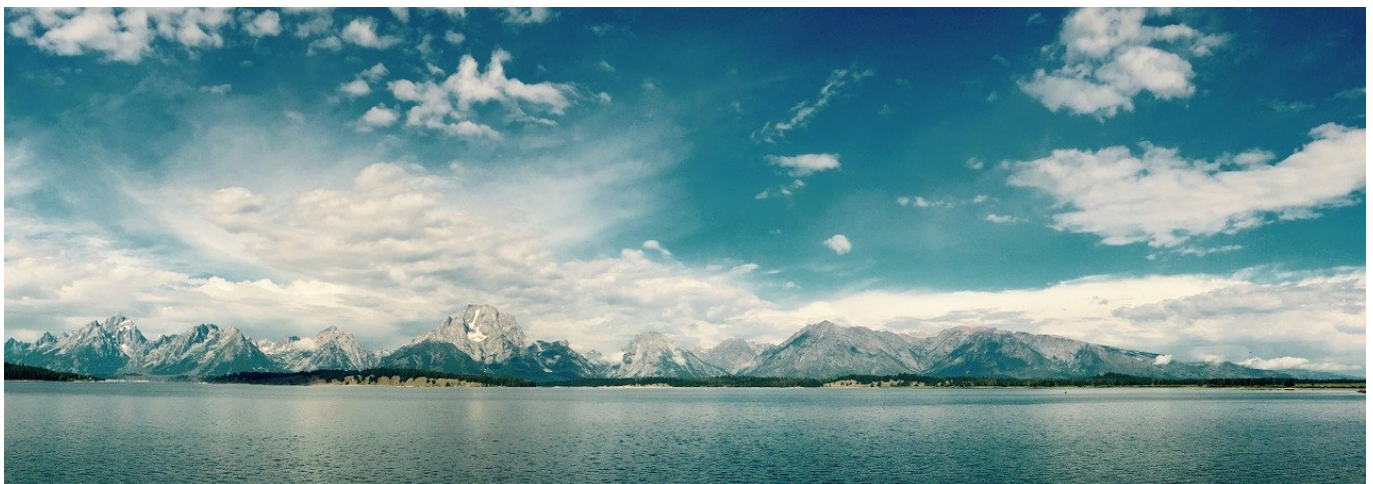
- *A feeling of great surprise or wonder.*
- *The feeling that accompanies something extremely surprising.*



Synonyms of "Amazement" as a noun (17 Words)

- astonishment** Great surprise.
*He looked at me in **astonishment**.*
- awe** Capacity to inspire awe.
*He stared over the edge with a feeling of **awe**.*
- bafflement** A flat plate that controls or directs the flow of fluid or energy.
*Most people experience a sense of **bafflement** about how anyone could carry out such a heinous deed.*
- bewilderment** Confusion resulting from failure to understand.
*There was **bewilderment** at the shift of government policy.*

confusion	An act causing a disorderly combination of elements with identities lost and distinctions blended. <i>The army retreated in confusion.</i>
consternation	Fear resulting from the awareness of danger. <i>To her consternation her car wouldn't start.</i>
devastation	The state of being decayed or destroyed. <i>She spoke of her devastation at his death.</i>
<u>disbelief</u>	Inability or refusal to accept that something is true or real. <i>Laura shook her head in disbelief.</i>
dismay	Fear resulting from the awareness of danger. <i>To his dismay she left him.</i>
incredulity	Doubt about the truth of something. <i>He stared down the street in incredulity.</i>
perplexity	Inability to deal with or understand something. <i>She paused in perplexity.</i>
shock	A reflex response to the passage of electric current through the body. <i>It was a shock to face such hostile attitudes.</i>
speechlessness	The property of being speechless.
stupefaction	Marginal consciousness. <i>Salesmen stood in bored stupefaction.</i>
surprise	A feeling of mild astonishment or shock caused by something unexpected. <i>Surprise major.</i>
wonder	Something that causes feelings of wonder. <i>We all eat cakes from Gisella she's a wonder.</i>
wonderment	A state of awed admiration or respect. <i>Corbett shook his head in silent wonderment.</i>



Usage Examples of "Amazement" as a noun

- *She shook her head in amazement.*
- *To her amazement, Bill was keen.*



Associations of "Amazement" (30 Words)

amaze	Surprise (someone) greatly; fill with astonishment. <i>He has been amazed by the quality of the employees at the bank.</i>
astonish	Affect with wonder. <i>You never fail to astonish me.</i>
astonishment	Great surprise. <i>He looked at me in astonishment.</i>
astound	Shock or greatly surprise. <i>Her bluntness astounded him.</i>

<u>astounding</u>	So surprisingly impressive as to stun or overwhelm. <i>An astounding achievement.</i>
<u>awe</u>	Inspire with awe. <i>Is it any wonder that Christmas Eve has lost its awe.</i>
awesome	Inspiring awe or admiration or wonder. <i>The awesome complexity of the universe.</i>
<u>bewilderment</u>	A feeling of being perplexed and confused. <i>There was bewilderment at the shift of government policy.</i>
comma	Anglewing butterfly with a comma shaped mark on the underside of each hind wing.
confusion	A disorderly jumble. <i>The army retreated in confusion.</i>
<u>daze</u>	(especially of an emotional or physical shock) make (someone) unable to think or react properly. <i>She was dazed by his revelations.</i>
<u>disbelief</u>	A rejection of belief. <i>I ll burn in hell for disbelief.</i>
<u>exclamation</u>	An exclamatory rhetorical device. <i>She gave an exclamation of delight.</i>
<u>flabbergasted</u>	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. <i>This news has left me totally flabbergasted.</i>
gasp	Strain to obtain air by gasping. <i>It s beautiful she gasped much impressed.</i>
incredible	Beyond belief or understanding. <i>An almost incredible tale of triumph and tragedy.</i>
incredulity	Doubt about the truth of something. <i>He stared down the street in incredulity.</i>
mystification	The activity of obscuring people's understanding, leaving them baffled or bewildered.
outcry	A loud utterance; often in protest or opposition. <i>An outcry of spontaneous passion.</i>
pant	Run or go in a specified direction while panting. <i>He was panting when he reached the top.</i>
<u>puff</u>	A light inflated pastry or puff shell. <i>Puff a cigar.</i>
punctuate	Occur at intervals throughout (an area or period). <i>The country s history has been punctuated by coups.</i>

punctuation	The marks, such as full stop, comma, and brackets, used in writing to separate sentences and their elements and to clarify meaning. <i>You will notice that no punctuation is used.</i>
serendipity	The occurrence and development of events by chance in a happy or beneficial way. <i>A fortunate stroke of serendipity.</i>
<u>startle</u>	A sudden involuntary movement. <i>She startled when I walked into the room.</i>
stun	Knock unconscious or into a dazed or semi-conscious state. <i>The news stunned her.</i>
stupefy	Make senseless or dizzy by or as if by a blow. <i>The amount they spend on clothes would appal their parents and stupefy their grandparents.</i>
surprise	Cause to be surprised. <i>The announcement came as a complete surprise.</i>
surprised	Feeling or showing surprise. <i>There was a surprised silence.</i>
wonder	Something that causes feelings of wonder. <i>Athens was a place of wonder and beauty.</i>
