- *A representative or promoter of a specified activity.*
- *An accredited diplomat sent by a state as its permanent representative in a foreign country.*
- *An informal representative.*

The official temporarily in charge of a diplomatic mission in the absence of the ambassador.

**consul**

An official appointed by a state to live in a foreign city and protect the state's citizens and interests there.

*The British **consul** in Israel.*

<b>deputy</b>	A parliamentary representative in certain countries. <i>The <b>deputy</b> prime minister.</i>
<b>diplomat</b>	A person who can deal with others in a sensitive and tactful way.
<b>ambassador</b>	A diplomat of the highest rank; accredited as representative from one country to another.
<u><b>emissary</b></u>	Someone sent on a mission to represent the interests of someone else.
<u><b>envoy</b></u>	A brief stanza concluding certain forms of poetry. <i>A peace <b>envoy</b>.</i>
<b>legate</b>	An ambassador or messenger. <i>The Roman <b>legate</b> of Syria.</i>
<b>nuncio</b>	(Roman Catholic Church) a diplomatic representative of the Pope having ambassadorial status.
<b>plenipotentiary</b>	A person, especially a diplomat, invested with the full power of independent action on behalf of their government, typically in a foreign country.
<b>representative</b>	An employee of a travel company who lives in a resort and looks after the needs of its holidaymakers. <i>A sales <b>representative</b> for Norwich Union.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Ambassador" as a noun

- *An ambassador of good will.*
- *The French ambassador to Portugal.*

## Associations of "Ambassador" (30 Words)

<u><b>abroad</b></u>	In or to a foreign country or countries. <i>Few people ventured <b>abroad</b> from their warm houses.</i>
<b>consul</b>	A diplomat appointed by a government to protect its commercial interests and help its citizens in a foreign country. <i>The British <b>consul</b> in Israel.</i>
<b>consulate</b>	The office or position of a consul. <i>He called at the <b>consulate</b> in Palestine to pick up a visa.</i>
<b>diplomacy</b>	Wisdom in the management of public affairs. <i>An extensive round of <b>diplomacy</b> in the Middle East.</i>

<b>diplomat</b>	A person who can deal with others in a sensitive and tactful way.
<b>diplomatic</b>	(of an edition or copy) exactly reproducing an original version. <i>The hostess averted a confrontation with a <b>diplomatic</b> change of subject.</i>
<b>diplomatist</b>	An official engaged in international negotiations.
<b>embassy</b>	The staff working in an embassy. <i>The <b>embassy</b> denied any involvement in the murder.</i>
<u><b>emissary</b></u>	Someone sent on a mission to represent the interests of someone else.
<u><b>envoy</b></u>	A minister plenipotentiary, ranking below ambassador and above chargé d'affaires. <i>A peace <b>envoy</b>.</i>
<u><b>foreign</b></u>	Of concern to or concerning the affairs of other nations (other than your own). <i><b>Foreign</b> particles in milk.</i>
<b>govern</b>	Require to be in a certain grammatical case, voice, or mood. <i>He does not have the ability to <b>govern</b> himself or others successfully.</i>
<u><b>government</b></u>	The study of government of states and other political units. <i>A democratic form of <b>government</b>.</i>
<u><b>messenger</b></u>	Send a document or package by messenger. <i>Nitric oxide is an intercellular <b>messenger</b>.</i>
<u><b>nation</b></u>	The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The world's leading industrialized <b>nations</b>.</i>
<b>negotiate</b>	Discuss the terms of an arrangement. <i>She cautiously <b>negotiated</b> the hairpin bend.</i>
<b>officer</b>	Direct or command as an officer. <i>Foreign mercenaries were hired to <b>officer</b> new regiments.</i>
<b>official</b>	Verified officially. <i>The prime minister's <b>official</b> engagements.</i>
<b>patrician</b>	Belonging to or characteristic of the nobility or aristocracy. <i>A proud <b>patrician</b> face.</i>
<u><b>patriot</b></u>	One who loves and defends his or her country. <i>A true <b>patriot</b>.</i>
<b>peace</b>	A treaty agreeing peace between warring states. <i>He just wanted to drink a few beers in <b>peace</b>.</i>
<b>plenipotentiary</b>	A diplomat who is fully authorized to represent his or her government. <i>A minister <b>plenipotentiary</b>.</i>

<b><u>politician</u></b>	A person who acts in a manipulative and devious way, typically to gain advancement within an organization. <i>A veteran communist <b>politician</b>.</i>
<b><u>politics</u></b>	A particular set of political beliefs or principles. <i>Yet another discussion of office <b>politics</b> and personalities.</i> The reestablishing of cordial relations.
<b>rapprochement</b>	<i>There were signs of a growing <b>rapprochement</b> between the two countries.</i>
<b>reconcilable</b>	Capable of being reconciled; compatible. <i>Her way of thinking is <b>reconcilable</b> with mine.</i>
<b>representative</b>	Being or characteristic of government by representation in which citizens exercise power through elected officers and representatives. <i>Free elections and <b>representative</b> democracy.</i>
<b>sinologist</b>	A student of Chinese history and language and culture.
<b>spokesperson</b>	A spokesman or spokeswoman (used as a neutral alternative). <i>The meeting was attended by <b>spokespersons</b> for all the major organs of government.</i>
<b>triumvir</b>	One of a group of three sharing public administration or civil authority especially in ancient Rome.
