- An accredited diplomat sent by a state as its permanent representative in a foreign country.
- An informal representative.

diplomat	A person who can deal with others in a sensitive and tactful way.
embassador	A diplomat of the highest rank; accredited as representative from one country to another.
<u>emissary</u>	Someone sent on a mission to represent the interests of someone else.
<u>envoy</u>	A brief stanza concluding certain forms of poetry. A peace <b>envoy</b> .
legate	An ambassador or messenger. The Roman <b>legate</b> of Syria.
nuncio	(Roman Catholic Church) a diplomatic representative of the Pope having ambassadorial status.
plenipotentiary	A person, especially a diplomat, invested with the full power of independent action on behalf of their government, typically in a foreign country.
representative	An employee of a travel company who lives in a resort and looks after the needs of its holidaymakers. A sales <b>representative</b> for Norwich Union.

govern	Require to be in a certain grammatical case, voice, or mood. He does not have the ability to <b>govern</b> himself or others successfully.
<u>government</u>	The study of government of states and other political units. A democratic form of <b>government</b> .
<u>messenger</u>	Send a document or package by messenger. <i>Nitric oxide is an intercellular <b>messenger</b>.</i>
<u>nation</u>	The people who live in a nation or country. The world s leading industrialized <b>nation</b> s.
negotiate	Discuss the terms of an arrangement. She cautiously <b>negotiate</b> d the hairpin bend.
officer	Direct or command as an officer. Foreign mercenaries were hired to <b>officer</b> new regiments.
official	Verified officially. The prime minister s <b>official</b> engagements.
patrician	Belonging to or characteristic of the nobility or aristocracy. <i>A proud patrician face.</i>
