- *An accredited diplomat sent by a state as its permanent representative in a foreign country.*
- *An informal representative.*

attaché

A specialist assigned to the staff of a diplomatic mission.

campaigner

A politician who is running for public office.

chargé d'affaires

The official temporarily in charge of a diplomatic mission in the absence of the ambassador.

consul

An official appointed by a state to live in a foreign city and protect the state's citizens and interests there.

*The British **consul** in Israel.*

deputy	A parliamentary representative in certain countries. <i>The deputy prime minister.</i>
diplomat	A person who can deal with others in a sensitive and tactful way.
ambassador	A diplomat of the highest rank; accredited as representative from one country to another.
<u>emissary</u>	Someone sent on a mission to represent the interests of someone else.
<u>envoy</u>	A brief stanza concluding certain forms of poetry. <i>A peace envoy.</i>
legate	An ambassador or messenger. <i>The Roman legate of Syria.</i>
nuncio	(Roman Catholic Church) a diplomatic representative of the Pope having ambassadorial status.
plenipotentiary	A person, especially a diplomat, invested with the full power of independent action on behalf of their government, typically in a foreign country.
representative	An employee of a travel company who lives in a resort and looks after the needs of its holidaymakers. <i>A sales representative for Norwich Union.</i>

- *The French ambassador to Portugal.*

Associations of "Ambassador" (30 Words)

<u>abroad</u>	In or to a foreign country or countries. <i>Few people ventured abroad from their warm houses.</i>
consul	A diplomat appointed by a government to protect its commercial interests and help its citizens in a foreign country. <i>The British consul in Israel.</i>
consulate	The office or position of a consul. <i>He called at the consulate in Palestine to pick up a visa.</i>
diplomacy	Wisdom in the management of public affairs. <i>An extensive round of diplomacy in the Middle East.</i>

diplomat	A person who can deal with others in a sensitive and tactful way.
diplomatic	(of an edition or copy) exactly reproducing an original version. <i>The hostess averted a confrontation with a diplomatic change of subject.</i>
diplomatist	An official engaged in international negotiations.
embassy	The staff working in an embassy. <i>The embassy denied any involvement in the murder.</i>
<u>emissary</u>	Someone sent on a mission to represent the interests of someone else.
<u>envoy</u>	A minister plenipotentiary, ranking below ambassador and above chargé d'affaires. <i>A peace envoy.</i>
<u>foreign</u>	Of concern to or concerning the affairs of other nations (other than your own). <i>Foreign particles in milk.</i>
govern	Require to be in a certain grammatical case, voice, or mood. <i>He does not have the ability to govern himself or others successfully.</i>
<u>government</u>	The study of government of states and other political units. <i>A democratic form of government.</i>
<u>messenger</u>	Send a document or package by messenger. <i>Nitric oxide is an intercellular messenger.</i>
<u>nation</u>	The people who live in a nation or country. <i>The world's leading industrialized nations.</i>
negotiate	Discuss the terms of an arrangement. <i>She cautiously negotiated the hairpin bend.</i>
officer	Direct or command as an officer. <i>Foreign mercenaries were hired to officer new regiments.</i>
official	Verified officially. <i>The prime minister's official engagements.</i>
patrician	Belonging to or characteristic of the nobility or aristocracy. <i>A proud patrician face.</i>
<u>patriot</u>	One who loves and defends his or her country. <i>A true patriot.</i>
peace	A treaty agreeing peace between warring states. <i>He just wanted to drink a few beers in peace.</i>
plenipotentiary	A diplomat who is fully authorized to represent his or her government. <i>A minister plenipotentiary.</i>

<u>politician</u>	A person who acts in a manipulative and devious way, typically to gain advancement within an organization. <i>A veteran communist politician.</i>
<u>politics</u>	A particular set of political beliefs or principles. <i>Yet another discussion of office politics and personalities.</i> The reestablishing of cordial relations.
rapprochement	<i>There were signs of a growing rapprochement between the two countries.</i>
reconcilable	Capable of being reconciled; compatible. <i>Her way of thinking is reconcilable with mine.</i>
representative	Being or characteristic of government by representation in which citizens exercise power through elected officers and representatives. <i>Free elections and representative democracy.</i>
sinologist	A student of Chinese history and language and culture.
spokesperson	A spokesman or spokeswoman (used as a neutral alternative). <i>The meeting was attended by spokespersons for all the major organs of government.</i>
triumvir	One of a group of three sharing public administration or civil authority especially in ancient Rome.
