- *The character and atmosphere of a place.*
- *Quality or character given to a sound recording by the space in which the sound occurs.*
- *A particular environment or surrounding influence.*



## Synonyms of "Ambience" as a noun (18 Words)

<b>air</b>	Referring to the use of aircraft. <i>The doctor told me to get some fresh <b>air</b>.</i>
<b><u>ambiance</u></b>	A particular environment or surrounding influence.
<b>atmosphere</b>	The air in any particular place. <i>The hotel has won commendations for its friendly welcoming <b>atmosphere</b>.</i>
<b><u>aura</u></b>	The distinctive atmosphere or quality that seems to surround and be generated by a person, thing, or place. <i>Emotional mental and spiritual levels form an energy field around the body known as the <b>aura</b>.</i>
<b>character</b>	A characteristic especially one that assists in the identification of a species. <i>The Greek alphabet has 24 <b>characters</b>.</i>
<b><u>climate</u></b>	A region with a particular climate. <i>The current economic <b>climate</b>.</i>
<b>complexion</b>	The natural colour, texture, and appearance of a person's skin, especially of the face. <i>A smooth pale <b>complexion</b>.</i>
<b><u>echo</u></b>	A close parallel to an idea, feeling, or event. <i>His love for her found an <b>echo</b> in her own feelings.</i>
<b>feel</b>	Feelings of heightened emotion. <i>It s easy when you get the <b>feel</b> of it.</i>
<b>feeling</b>	An attitude or opinion. <i>What are your <b>feelings</b> about the crisis.</i>
<b>flavour</b>	A substance used to alter or enhance the taste of food or drink a flavouring. <i>The extracts give a <b>flavour</b> of the content and tone of the conversation.</i>
<b><u>impression</u></b>	An impressionistic portrayal of a person. <i>His first <b>impressions</b> of Manchester were very positive.</i>
<b>look</b>	An expression of a feeling or thought by looking. <i>The government should take a <b>look</b> at the amount of grant the council receives.</i>
<b>mood</b>	An angry, irritable, or sullen state of mind. <i>A concept album which captures the <b>mood</b> of modern times.</i>
<b>quality</b>	An essential and distinguishing attribute of something or someone-Shakespeare. <i>These colleges provide a better <b>quality</b> of education.</i>

**spirit**

The non-physical part of a person which is the seat of emotions and character; the soul.

*He was in good **spirits**.*

**tenor**

An adult male with a tenor voice.

*Several members of the party had been able to put in the **tenor** and the bass.*

**tone**

A musical interval of two semitones.

*A reduction of muscle **tone**.*

## Associations of "Ambience" (30 Words)

<b>acquiescence</b>	Acceptance without protest. <i>A murmur of <b>acquiescence</b> from the assembly.</i>
<b>amicable</b>	Characterized by friendship and good will. <i>An <b>amicable</b> settlement of the dispute.</i>
<b>calm</b>	Cause to be calm or quiet as by administering a sedative to. <i>A dead <b>calm</b> sea.</i>
<u><b>calmness</b></u>	The state or quality of being free from agitation or strong emotion. <i>This relative <b>calmness</b> ended at around 7 a m when the wind picked up speed.</i>
<b>composed</b>	Serenely self-possessed and free from agitation especially in times of stress. <i>The performer seemed completely <b>composed</b> as she stepped onto the stage.</i>
<b>halcyon</b>	Denoting a period of time in the past that was idyllically happy and peaceful. <i>A <b>halcyon</b> atmosphere.</i>
<u><b>hush</b></u>	Run water over the ground to erode (soil), revealing the underlying strata and valuable minerals. <i><b>Hush</b> my baby.</i>
<u><b>idyllic</b></u>	Suggestive of an idyll; charmingly simple and serene. <i>His <b>idyllic</b> life in Tahiti.</i>
<u><b>imperturbable</b></u>	Unable to be upset or excited; calm. <i>Hitherto <b>imperturbable</b> he now showed signs of alarm.</i>
<b>noiseless</b>	Making no sound- Shakespeare. <i>The 4000 1 and 4000 2 use an adaptive <b>noiseless</b> data algorithm to compress data in real time.</i>
<b>nonviolence</b>	Peaceful resistance to a government by fasting or refusing to cooperate.
<b>pacific</b>	Relating to the Pacific Ocean. <i>A <b>pacific</b> gesture.</i>
<b>peace</b>	A treaty agreeing peace between warring states. <i>The 8 8 per cent offer promises <b>peace</b> with the union.</i>
<b>peaceable</b>	Inclined to avoid conflict or dissent. <i><b>Peaceable</b> demonstrations for democratic reform.</i>
<b>peaceful</b>	Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. <i>His <b>peaceful</b> mood vanished.</i>

<b>peacetime</b>	A period of time during which there is no war. <i>In <b>peacetime</b> regiments were billeted upon towns and villages.</i>
<b>placid</b>	Free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>Not everyone shared his <b>placid</b> temperament.</i>
<b>pleasant</b>	(of persons) having pleasing manners or behavior. <i><b>Pleasant</b> sensations.</i>
<b>quietude</b>	A state of peace and quiet. <i>It highlights her <b>quietude</b> and wise passivity.</i>
<b>relaxing</b>	Reducing tension or anxiety. <i>A <b>relaxing</b> massage with aromatherapy oils.</i>
<b>restful</b>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>She spent a <b>restful</b> night at home.</i>
<b>reticence</b>	The quality of being reticent; reserve. <i>The traditional emotional <b>reticence</b> of the British.</i>
<b>serene</b>	An expanse of clear sky or calm sea. <i>A <b>serene</b> expression on her face.</i>
<b>serenity</b>	A title given to a reigning prince or similar dignitary. <i>An oasis of <b>serenity</b> amidst the bustling city.</i>
<b>silence</b>	Stop or suppress (a sound or noise); cause to become silent. <i>The game was preceded by a two minute <b>silence</b> in his memory.</i>
<b>stillness</b>	(poetic) tranquil silence. <i>Absolute <b>stillness</b> greeted our gaze.</i>
<b>tranquil</b>	Free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>A lake of <b>tranquil</b> blue water reflecting a <b>tranquil</b> blue sky.</i>
<b>tranquility</b>	A state of peace and quiet.
<b>tranquillity</b>	A state of peace and quiet. <i>Passing cars are the only noise that disturbs the <b>tranquillity</b> of rural life.</i>
<b>unflappable</b>	Not easily perturbed or excited or upset; marked by extreme calm and composure. <i><b>Unflappable</b> in a crisis.</i>
