<u>acquaintance</u>	Acquaintances considered collectively. <i>I renewed my acquaintance with Herbert.</i>
<u>acquainted</u>	Having fair knowledge of. <i>They were acquainted.</i>
affair	Business and financial dealings. <i>The party was quite an affair.</i>
<u>approximate</u>	Judge tentatively or form an estimate of (quantities or time). <i>Sketched in an approximate likeness.</i>
around	All around or on all sides. <i>He needs advice from someone who s been around.</i>
close	Fitting closely but comfortably. <i>Kept a close watch on expenditures.</i>
<u>closely</u>	In an attentive manner. <i>A closely guarded plan.</i>
<u>closeness</u>	The spatial property resulting from a relatively small distance. <i>Moments of closeness with friends and family members.</i>
<u>confidant</u>	A person with whom one shares a secret or private matter, trusting them not to repeat it to others. <i>A close confidante of the princess.</i>
conjugal	Of or relating to marriage or to the relationship between a wife and husband. <i>Conjugal loyalty.</i>
connected	Plugged in. <i>All the window alarms are connected.</i>
<u>conversant</u>	Familiar with or knowledgeable about something. <i>You need someone who is conversant with the new technology.</i>

cozy	A padded cloth covering to keep a teapot warm. <i>The small room was cozy and intimate.</i>
familiar	Well informed about or knowing thoroughly. <i>She had not realized they were on such familiar terms.</i>
familiarity	Personal knowledge or information about someone or something. <i>Familiarity allows us to give each other nicknames.</i>
friendship	The emotions or conduct of friends; the state of being friends. <i>This is an ideal group for finding support and friendship.</i>
informed	Having or showing knowledge of a subject or situation. <i>Obtaining informed consent from research participants is central to ethical research practice.</i>
interdependent	(of two or more people or things) dependent on each other. <i>We in Europe are all increasingly interdependent.</i>
intimacy	Closeness of observation or knowledge of a subject. <i>The room had a peaceful sense of intimacy about it.</i>
intimate	Closely acquainted; familiar. <i>Intimate relations between economics politics and legal principles.</i>
intimately	In a sexual way. <i>Themes of love and death were intimately connected.</i>
involvement	A usually secretive or illicit sexual relationship. <i>There was additional involvement of the liver and spleen.</i>
know	Have knowledge or information concerning. <i>We know this movie.</i>
prevailing	Having most appeal or influence; prevalent. <i>The unfavourable prevailing economic conditions.</i>
proximity	Nearness in space, time, or relationship. <i>Do not operate microphones in close proximity to television sets.</i>
relationship	A relation between people relationship is often used where relation would serve as in the relationship between inflation and unemployment but the preferred usage of relationship is for human relations or states of relatedness. <i>The landlord tenant relationship.</i>
skillful	Done with delicacy and skill. <i>A lesser known but no less skillful composer.</i>
snug	Well and tightly constructed. <i>A snug little sailboat.</i>

surrounded

Confined on all sides.
*A camp **surrounded** by enemies.*
