unresolved Characterized by musical dissonance harmonically unresolved.

unsure Lacking self-confidence.

The date is **unsure**.

vacillating Uncertain in purpose or action.

He was accused of **vacillating** leadership.

wavering Undecided between two opinions or courses of action.
