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## Associations of "Ambulance" (30 Words)

<b><a href="#">ablaze</a></b>	Lighted up by or as by fire or flame. <i>His face all <b>ablaze</b> with excitement.</i>
<b>blaze</b>	Indicate by marking trees with blazes. <i>Meteors <b>blazed</b> across the atmosphere.</i>
<b>bleeding</b>	The flow of blood from a ruptured blood vessel. <i>The watch was a <b>bleeding</b> copy.</i>
<b>brake</b>	Cause to stop by applying the brakes. <i>We had to <b>brake</b> suddenly when a chicken crossed the road.</i> An incidental expense.
<b><a href="#">contingency</a></b>	<i>The island s public affairs can occasionally be seen to be invaded by <b>contingency</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">crisis</a></b>	A time of intense difficulty or danger. <i>The current economic <b>crisis</b>.</i>
<b>danger</b>	A dangerous place. <i>There was a <b>danger</b> he would do the wrong thing.</i>
<b><a href="#">deliverance</a></b>	The action of being rescued or set free. <i>The low drawl he employed for such <b>deliverances</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">driver</a></b>	A golfer who hits the golf ball with a driver. <i>Mule <b>drivers</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">emergency</a></b>	Arising from or used in an emergency. <i>Survival packs were carried in case of <b>emergency</b>.</i>
<b>emergent</b>	An emergent tree or other plant. <i>Knowledge is an <b>emergent</b> of this interactive process.</i>
<b>entreaty</b>	Earnest or urgent request. <i>An <b>entreaty</b> to stop the fighting.</i>
<b>evacuate</b>	Excrete or discharge from the body. <i>After the earthquake residents were <b>evacuated</b>.</i>

<b>evacuation</b>	A quantity of matter discharged from the bowels or another bodily organ. <i>Those who required an <b>evacuation</b> of retained products.</i>
<b>exigency</b>	A sudden unforeseen crisis (usually involving danger) that requires immediate action. <i>He put financial <b>exigency</b> before personal sentiment.</i>
<b><u>exigent</u></b>	Pressing; demanding. <i>The <b>exigent</b> demands of her contemporaries music took a toll on her voice.</i>
<b>extinguish</b>	Extinguish by crushing. <i>Too big to be <b>extinguished</b> at once the forest fires at best could be contained.</i>
<b>firefighter</b>	A member of a fire department who tries to extinguish fires.
<b>fireman</b>	A laborer who tends fires (as on a coal-fired train or steamship).
<b><u>imperative</u></b>	Relating to verbs in the imperative mood. <i>Immediate action was <b>imperative</b>.</i>
<b>inquest</b>	An inquiry by a coroner's court into the cause of a death. <i>An <b>inquest</b> by New York newspapers into a subway fire.</i>
<b><u>instant</u></b>	Instant coffee. <i>Your letter of the 6th <b>instant</b>.</i>
<b>medic</b>	A medical practitioner or student.
<b>paramedic</b>	A person trained to give emergency medical care to people who are injured or ill, typically in a setting outside a hospital. <i>A <b>paramedic</b> team was on its way.</i>
<b>pressing</b>	The act of pressing the exertion of pressure. <i>Pure grade olive oil is the product of the second or third <b>pressings</b>.</i>
<b><u>prioritize</u></b>	Assign a priority to. <i>Age affects the way people <b>prioritize</b> their goals.</i>
<b>suffocation</b>	The condition of being deprived of oxygen (as by having breathing stopped). <i>The occupants died of <b>suffocation</b> inside the airtight compartment.</i>
<b>tourniquet</b>	A device for stopping the flow of blood through a vein or artery, typically by compressing a limb with a cord or tight bandage.
<b>urgency</b>	The state of being urgent; an earnest and insistent necessity. <i>The discovery of the ozone hole gave <b>urgency</b> to the issue of CFCs.</i>
<b>urgent</b>	Of an action or event done or arranged in response to an urgent situation. <i>Bridges in <b>urgent</b> need of repair.</i>
