- *Open to being acted upon in a certain way.*
- *Liable to answer to a higher authority.*
- *Capable of being acted upon in a particular way; susceptible.*

<b>biddable</b>	Willing to carry out the orders or wishes of another without protest. <i>A <b>biddable</b> sweet natured child.</i>
<b>complaisant</b>	Showing a cheerful willingness to do favors for others. <i>There are too many <b>complaisant</b> doctors signing sick notes.</i>
<b>compliant</b>	Inclined to comply. <i>Food that is <b>compliant</b> with safety regulations.</i>
<b>conformable</b>	(of strata in contact) deposited in a continuous sequence, and having the same direction of stratification. <i>I have been to you a true and humble wife at all times to your will <b>conformable</b>.</i>
<b>controllable</b>	Capable of being safely regulated or limited. <i>Discontent began to give way to barely <b>controllable</b> rage.</i>
<a href="#"><u>docile</u></a>	Willing to be taught or led or supervised or directed. <i>She s a black Labrador gentle and <b>docile</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>flexible</u></a>	(of a person) ready and able to change so as to adapt to different circumstances. <i>Small businesses which are dependent on <b>flexible</b> working hours.</i>
<b>governable</b>	Capable of being controlled.
<a href="#"><u>malleable</u></a>	Easily influenced; pliable. <i>They are as <b>malleable</b> and easily led as sheep.</i>
<a href="#"><u>manageable</u></a>	Able to be controlled or dealt with without difficulty. <i>Her long hair was black wavy and <b>manageable</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>meek</u></a>	Humble in spirit or manner; suggesting retiring mildness or even cowed submissiveness. <i><b>Meek</b> as a mouse.</i>
<a href="#"><u>obedient</u></a>	Complying or willing to comply with an order or request; submissive to another's authority. <i>A docile and <b>obedient</b> dog.</i>
<b>persuadable</b>	Being susceptible to persuasion. <i>They need to identify the most <b>persuadable</b> voters.</i>
<b>pliant</b>	Capable of being bent or flexed or twisted without breaking. <i><b>Pliant</b> molten glass.</i>

<b>reactive</b>	Showing an immune response to a specific antigen. <i>Nitrogen dioxide is a highly <b>reactive</b> gas.</i>
<b><u>receptive</u></b>	Open to arguments, ideas, or change. <i>The paper is ink <b>receptive</b>.</i>
<b><u>responsive</u></b>	Containing or using responses; alternating. <i>Children are often the quickest and most <b>responsive</b> members of the audience.</i>
<b>submissive</b>	Abjectly submissive characteristic of a slave or servant S H Adams. <b>Submissive</b> servants.
<b><u>susceptible</u></b>	(of a person) easily influenced by feelings or emotions; sensitive. <i>Patients with liver disease may be <b>susceptible</b> to infection.</i>
<b>tame</b>	(of a plant) produced by cultivation. <b>Tame</b> obedience.
<b><u>tractable</u></b>	Responsive to suggestions and influences. <b>Tractable</b> young minds.
<b><u>vulnerable</u></b>	(of a person) in need of special care, support, or protection because of age, disability, or risk of abuse or neglect. <b>Vulnerable</b> parts of the body.

<b>bowed</b>	Of a stringed instrument; sounded by stroking with a bow.
<b>chasten</b>	Censure severely. <i>The director was somewhat <b>chastened</b> by his recent flops.</i>
<b>civilize</b>	Raise from a barbaric to a civilized state. <i>The wild child found wandering in the forest was gradually <b>civilized</b>.</i>
<b>compliant</b>	Inclined to comply. <i>Children <b>compliant</b> with the parental will.</i>
<b>conformable</b>	Disposed or willing to comply. <i>I have been to you a true and humble wife at all times to your will <b>conformable</b>.</i>

<b>controllable</b>	Capable of being safely regulated or limited. <i>The glider was fully <b>controllable</b>.</i>
<b><u>docile</u></b>	Easily handled or managed. <i><b>Docile</b> pupils eager for instruction.</i>
<b>doctrinaire</b>	A doctrinaire person. <i>The administration s <b>doctrinaire</b> economic policy.</i>
<b><u>domestic</u></b>	Converted or adapted to domestic use. <i><b>Domestic</b> water supplies.</i>
<b>domesticate</b>	Cultivate (a plant) for food. <i>You ve quite <b>domesticated</b> him.</i>
<b>domesticated</b>	Converted or adapted to domestic use. <i><b>Domesticated</b> plants like maize.</i>
<b>dominated</b>	Controlled or ruled by superior authority or power.
<b>dutiful</b>	Willingly obedient out of a sense of duty and respect. <i>A <b>dutiful</b> citizen.</i>
<b>follow</b>	Come as a logical consequence follow logically. <i>Supporters who have <b>followed</b> the club through thick and thin.</i>
<b><u>malleable</u></b>	(of a metal or other material) able to be hammered or pressed into shape without breaking or cracking. <i><b>Malleable</b> metals such as gold.</i>
<b><u>manageable</u></b>	Able to be controlled or dealt with without difficulty. <i>Her long hair was black wavy and <b>manageable</b>.</i>
<b><u>meek</u></b>	Evidencing little spirit or courage; overly submissive or compliant. <i>She looked <b>meek</b> but had the heart of a lion.</i>
<b><u>obedience</u></b>	Observance of a monastic rule. <i><b>Obedience</b> to moral standards.</i>
<b><u>obedient</u></b>	Complying or willing to comply with an order or request; submissive to another's authority. <i>The <b>obedient</b> colonies are heavily taxed the refractory remain unburdened.</i>
<b>subdued</b>	Not brilliant or glaring. <i><b>Subdued</b> lights and soft music.</i>
<b>submissive</b>	Abjectly submissive characteristic of a slave or servant S H Adams. <i><b>Submissive</b> servants.</i>
<b>subservience</b>	Abject or cringing submissiveness. <i>Blind <b>subservience</b> to authority.</i>

- subservient** Serving as a means to an end.  
*Editors and journalists who express opinions in print that are opposed to the interests of the rich are dismissed and replaced by **subservient** ones.*
- susceptible** (of a person) easily influenced by feelings or emotions; sensitive.  
*Patients with liver disease may be **susceptible** to infection.*
- tame** Make less strong or intense; soften.  
*The battle to **tame** inflation.*
- tractability** The trait of being easily persuaded.
- tractable** Responsive to suggestions and influences.  
*The natives being of an intelligent **tractable** disposition.*
- willing** The act of making a choice.  
***Willing** helpers.*
