**comforts** The act of consoling; giving relief in affliction.

**conveniences** A device or control that is very useful for a particular job.

**creature comforts** A human being; `wight' is an archaic term.



## Associations of "Amenities" (30 Words)

**activity** A thermodynamic quantity representing the effective concentration of a particular component in a solution or other system equal to its concentration multiplied by an activity coefficient.  
*Respiratory **activity**.*

**avocation** A hobby or minor occupation.  
*They are basically doctors and negotiators by **avocation**.*

<b>badinage</b>	Humorous or witty conversation. <i>He developed a nice line in <b>badinage</b> with the Labour leader.</i>
<b>basketball</b>	The inflated ball used in basketball.
<b>bingo</b>	A game in which numbered balls are drawn at random and players cover the corresponding numbers on their cards. <i>A <b>bingo</b> hall.</i>
<b>boat</b>	A serving dish in the shape of a boat. <i>She likes to go <b>boating</b>.</i>
<b>boxing</b>	The enclosure of something in a package or box.
<b>canoe</b>	Travel by canoe. <i>He had once <b>canoed</b> down the Nile.</i>
<b>championship</b>	The position or title of the winner of a championship contest. <i>A <b>championship</b> course.</i>
<b>chess</b>	A board game for two players who move their 16 pieces according to specific rules; the object is to checkmate the opponent's king.
<b>entertainment</b>	An event, performance, or activity designed to entertain others. <i>A theatrical <b>entertainment</b>.</i>
<b>fishing</b>	The occupation of catching fish for a living. <i>The area is renowned for its excellent deep sea <b>fishing</b>.</i>
<b>football</b>	Any of various forms of team game involving kicking and in some cases also handling a ball in particular in the UK soccer or in the US American football. <i>Wherever the president travels a military aide stays close with the <b>football</b>.</i>
<b>game</b>	Games the score at a particular point or the score needed to win. <i>Buy your <b>games</b> and software from us.</i>
<b>hobby</b>	A child's plaything consisting of an imitation horse mounted on rockers; the child straddles it and pretends to ride. <i>Her hobbies are reading and gardening.</i>
<b>leisure</b>	Time when one is not working or occupied; free time. <i>Increased opportunities for <b>leisure</b>.</i>
<b>outing</b>	A journey taken for pleasure. <i>Madonna's first screen <b>outing</b> in three years.</i>
<b>partake</b>	Have some of the qualities or attributes of something. <i>Visitors can <b>partake</b> in golfing or clay pigeon shooting.</i>

<b>pastime</b>	An activity that someone does regularly for enjoyment rather than work; a hobby. <i>His main <b>pastime</b> is gambling.</i>
<b>philately</b>	The collection and study of postage stamps.
<b>picnic</b>	Have or take part in a picnic. <i>We <b>picnicked</b> near the lake on this gorgeous Sunday.</i>
<b>recreation</b>	Activity that refreshes and recreates; activity that renews your health and spirits by enjoyment and relaxation. <i>For <b>recreation</b> he wrote poetry and solved crossword puzzles.</i>
<b>recreational</b>	Relating to or denoting drugs taken on an occasional basis for enjoyment. <i>Reading matter that is both <b>recreational</b> and mentally stimulating.</i>
<b>refreshment</b>	A light snack or drink. <i>Time for rest and <b>refreshment</b> by the pool.</i>
<b>sea</b>	A roughly definable area of the sea. <i>A <b>sea</b> view.</i>
<b>sporting</b>	Preoccupied with the pursuit of pleasure and especially games of chance. <i><b>Sporting</b> gents and their ladies.</i>
<b>stadium</b>	An ancient Roman or Greek measure of length about 185 metres originally the length of a stadium.
<b>tourism</b>	The business of providing services to tourists. <i>A national fund for the promotion of <b>tourism</b>.</i>
<b>tournament</b>	A series of jousts between knights contesting for a prize. <i>The Royal <b>Tournament</b>.</i>
<b>travel</b>	Travel from place to place as for the purpose of finding work preaching or acting as a judge. <i>Perhaps you ll write a book about your <b>travels</b>.</i>
