### Definitions of "Amok" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "amok" as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Wildly; without self-control.*
- *In a murderous frenzy.*



### Synonyms of "Amok" as an adverb (2 Words)

- amuck** Wildly; without self-control.  
*Rioters running **amuck** and throwing sticks and bottles and stones.*
- murderously** As if bent on murder.

- berserk** Frenzied as if possessed by a demon.  
*A **berserk** worker smashing windows.*
- bipolar** Of a person suffering from bipolar disorder.  
*A sharply **bipolar** division of affluent and underclass.*
