- *Wildly; without self-control.*
- *In a murderous frenzy.*



Synonyms of "Amok" as an adverb (2 Words)

- amuck** Wildly; without self-control.
*Rioters running **amuck** and throwing sticks and bottles and stones.*
- murderously** As if bent on murder.

- berserk** Frenzied as if possessed by a demon.
*A **berserk** worker smashing windows.*
- bipolar** Of a person suffering from bipolar disorder.
*A sharply **bipolar** division of affluent and underclass.*

crazy	(of a ship or building) full of cracks or flaws; unsound. <i>The noise was driving me crazy.</i>
demented	Suffering from dementia. <i>She was demented with worry.</i>
demonic	Relating to or characteristic of a demon or demons. <i>Demonic rage.</i>
deranged	Driven insane. <i>A deranged gunman.</i>
disturbed	Affected with madness or insanity. <i>Disturbed grass showed where the horse had passed.</i>
folly	A theatrical revue with glamorous female performers. <i>An act of sheer folly.</i>
foolery	Foolish or senseless behavior. <i>We endured his foolery all afternoon.</i>
harebrained	Very foolish. <i>Harebrained ideas.</i>
insane	Extremely foolish; irrational. <i>They were making insane amounts of money.</i>
insanity	Relatively permanent disorder of the mind. <i>It might be pure insanity to take this loan.</i>
loon	A silly or foolish person. <i>If only she weren't such a lovesick loon.</i>
lunacy	Foolish or senseless behavior. <i>It has been suggested that originality demands a degree of lunacy.</i>
lunatic	Extremely foolish or eccentric. <i>He would be asked to acquiesce in some lunatic scheme.</i>
mad	Make someone mad. <i>Antony's mother told him he was mad to be leaving Dublin.</i>
madden	Make (someone) extremely annoyed. <i>His behavior is maddening.</i>
maniac	An insane person. <i>A religious maniac.</i>
maniacal	Wildly disordered. <i>A maniacal frenzy.</i>
mentally	In a manner relating to the mind. <i>Soldiers become physically and mentally exhausted.</i>

nuts	Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular. <i>The way he turns on the television as soon as he walks in drives me nuts.</i>
<u>paranoid</u>	A person who is paranoid. <i>Further accusations would sound like the ramblings of a paranoid.</i>
psychiatrist	A medical practitioner specializing in the diagnosis and treatment of mental illness.
<u>psychopath</u>	Someone with a sociopathic personality a person with an antisocial personality disorder psychopath was once widely used but has now been superseded by sociopath. <i>Playground psychopaths will gather around a fight to encourage the combatants.</i>
psychopathic	Suffering from or constituting a chronic mental disorder with abnormal or violent social behaviour. <i>A psychopathic disorder.</i>
raving	In a raving manner. <i>The ravings of a madwoman.</i>
schizophrenia	(in general use) a mentality or approach characterized by inconsistent or contradictory elements. <i>Gibraltar s schizophrenia continues to be fed by colonial pride.</i>
unbalanced	Not giving accurate, fair, or equal coverage to all aspects; partial. <i>This may give an unbalanced impression of the competition.</i>
wacko	A crazy person. <i>A trailer park peopled by exotic wackos and misfits.</i>
