- (of a group of people or an organization) unorganized or unfocused.
- Lacking a clear structure or focus.
- Without real or apparent crystalline form.
- Lacking the system or structure characteristic of living bodies.
- Having no definite form or distinct shape.
- Without a clearly defined shape or form.
- Unclear because vague or badly organized.
- (of a solid) not crystalline, or not apparently crystalline.





Synonyms of "Amorphous" as an adjective (11 Words)

unformed Not having developed or been developed fully.

He had an ambitious albeit **unformed** idea for a novel.

unshaped Having a vague, ill-formed, or unfinished shape.


Unshaped dough.

unstructured Lacking definite structure or organization.

Children in an **unstructured** environment often feel insecure.

Not clearly understood or expressed-Anatole Broyard- P.A.So.

Many patients suffer **vague** symptoms.



Usage Examples of "Amorphous" as an adjective
