### Definitions of "Amorphous" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “amorphous” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

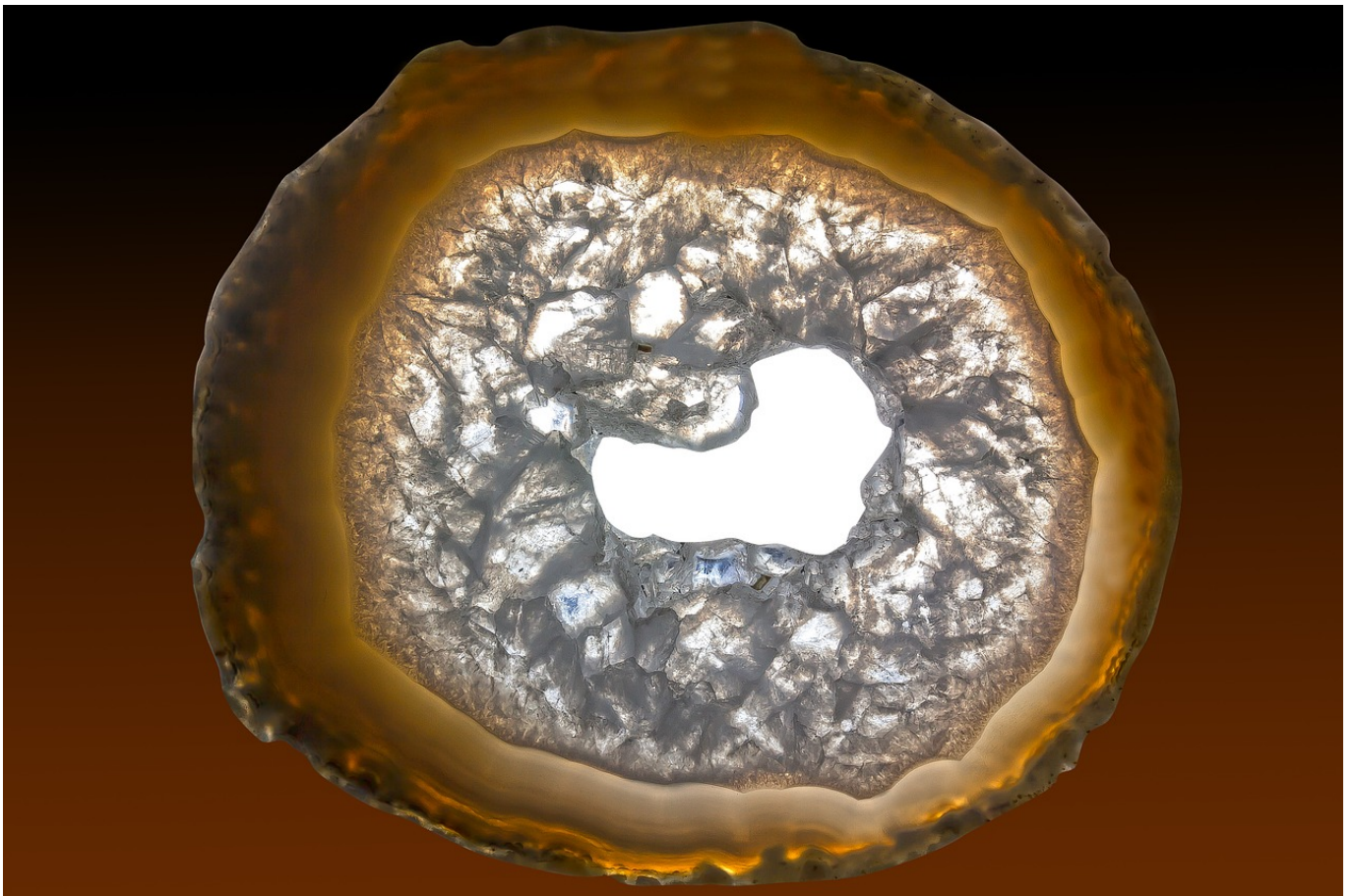
- *(of a group of people or an organization) unorganized or unfocused.*
- *Lacking a clear structure or focus.*
- *Without real or apparent crystalline form.*
- *Lacking the system or structure characteristic of living bodies.*
- *Having no definite form or distinct shape.*
- *Without a clearly defined shape or form.*
- *Unclear because vague or badly organized.*
- *(of a solid) not crystalline, or not apparently crystalline.*



## Synonyms of "Amorphous" as an adjective (11 Words)

- formless** Having no physical form.  
*A dark and **formless** idea.*
- indefinite** Vague or not clearly defined or stated.  
*He would not answer so **indefinite** a proposal.*
- indeterminate** Not precisely determined or established; not fixed or known in advance.  
*The abolition of the **indeterminate** borstal sentence for young offenders.*
- nebulous** Lacking definite form or limits- H.T.Moore.  
*A giant **nebulous** glow.*
- shapeless** Having no definite form or distinct shape.  
*A **shapeless** hat on his head.*
- uncrystallised** Without real or apparent crystalline form.
- uncrystallized** Without real or apparent crystalline form.  
***Uncrystallized** ideas.*

<b>unformed</b>	Not having developed or been developed fully. <i>He had an ambitious albeit <b>unformed</b> idea for a novel.</i>
<b>unshaped</b>	Having a vague, ill-formed, or unfinished shape. <i><b>Unshaped</b> dough.</i>
<b>unstructured</b>	Lacking definite structure or organization. <i>Children in an <b>unstructured</b> environment often feel insecure.</i>
<b>vague</b>	Not clearly understood or expressed-Anatole Broyard- P.A.So. <i>Many patients suffer <b>vague</b> symptoms.</i>



## Usage Examples of "Amorphous" as an adjective

- *An amorphous and leaderless legislature.*
- *An amorphous polymer.*
- *Amorphous structure.*
- *Her vague, amorphous statement of her predicament was part of what made it so hard for her to solve it.*
- *An amorphous mineral.*

## Associations of "Amorphous" (30 Words)

- autonomous** (of political bodies) not controlled by outside forces.  
*The spread of **autonomous** robotic weaponry.*
- confused** Having lost your bearings confused as to time or place or personal identity.  
*The sound of a sort of **confused** hammering and shouting.*
- disjointed** Lacking orderly continuity.  
*A **disjointed** fowl.*
- disordered** Thrown into a state of disarray or confusion.  
*She went to comb her **disordered** hair.*

<b>disorganized</b>	Unable to plan one's activities efficiently. <i>She was too <b>disorganized</b> to be an agreeable roommate.</i>
<b>dispersion</b>	The pattern of distribution of individuals within a habitat. <i>The virus is transmitted in the <b>dispersion</b> of droplets which results from sneezing or coughing.</i>
<b>distributed</b>	(of a computer system) spread over several machines, especially over a network. <i>The <b>distributed</b> supplies are meticulously monitored to make sure everyone gets their share.</i>
<b>garbled</b>	Lacking orderly continuity. <i>I got a <b>garbled</b> set of directions.</i>
<b>illogical</b>	Lacking in correct logical relation. <i>An <b>illogical</b> fear of the supernatural.</i>
<b>incoherent</b>	(of a person) unable to speak intelligibly. <i>He screamed some <b>incoherent</b> threat.</i>
<b>independent</b>	An independent political candidate. <i><b>Independent</b> television.</i>
<b>muddle</b>	Busy oneself in an aimless or ineffective way. <i>He made a <b>muddle</b> of his marriage.</i>
<b>oasis</b>	A fertile tract in a desert (where the water table approaches the surface). <i>The park is an <b>oasis</b> of calm in the centre of the city.</i>
<b>proliferation</b>	Growth by the rapid multiplication of parts. <i>We attempted to measure cell <b>proliferation</b>.</i>
<b>rumor</b>	Tell or spread rumors. <i>It was <b>rumored</b> that the next president would be a woman.</i>
<b>scattered</b>	(of electromagnetic radiation or particles) deflected or diffused. <i><b>Scattered</b> villages.</i>
<b>separate</b>	Separated according to race sex class or religion. <i>Police were trying to <b>separate</b> two rioting mobs.</i>
<b>separated</b>	Separated at the joint. <i>Thought of herself as alone and <b>separated</b> from the others.</i>
<b>separatist</b>	Relating to separatists or separatism. <i>Religious <b>separatists</b>.</i>
<b>spread</b>	A bedspread. <i>The <b>spread</b> of the urban population into rural areas.</i>
<b>spreading</b>	The opening of a subject to widespread discussion and debate.

<b>state</b>	The three traditional states of matter are solids fixed shape and volume and liquids fixed volume and shaped by the container and gases filling the container. <i>People will be invited to <b>state</b> their views.</i>
<b>throughout</b>	Used to refer to cited works. <i>The house is in good order <b>throughout</b>.</i>
<b>unformed</b>	Without a definite form or shape. <i>An as yet <b>unformed</b> government.</i>
<b><u>unlike</u></b>	Marked by dissimilarity. <i>They seemed utterly <b>unlike</b> despite being twins.</i>
<b><u>unorganized</u></b>	Not having or belonging to a structured whole. <i><b>Unorganized</b> territories lack a formal government.</i>
<b>unrestricted</b>	Not limited or restricted. <i>I had <b>unrestricted</b> access.</i>
<b>widely</b>	By many people or in many places. <i>Lending policies vary <b>widely</b> between different banks.</i>
<b>wild</b>	In a wild or undomesticated manner. <i><b>Wild</b> shouts.</i>
<b><u>yet</u></b>	Up until the present or a specified or implied time; by now or then. <i><b>Yet</b> another diet book.</i>
