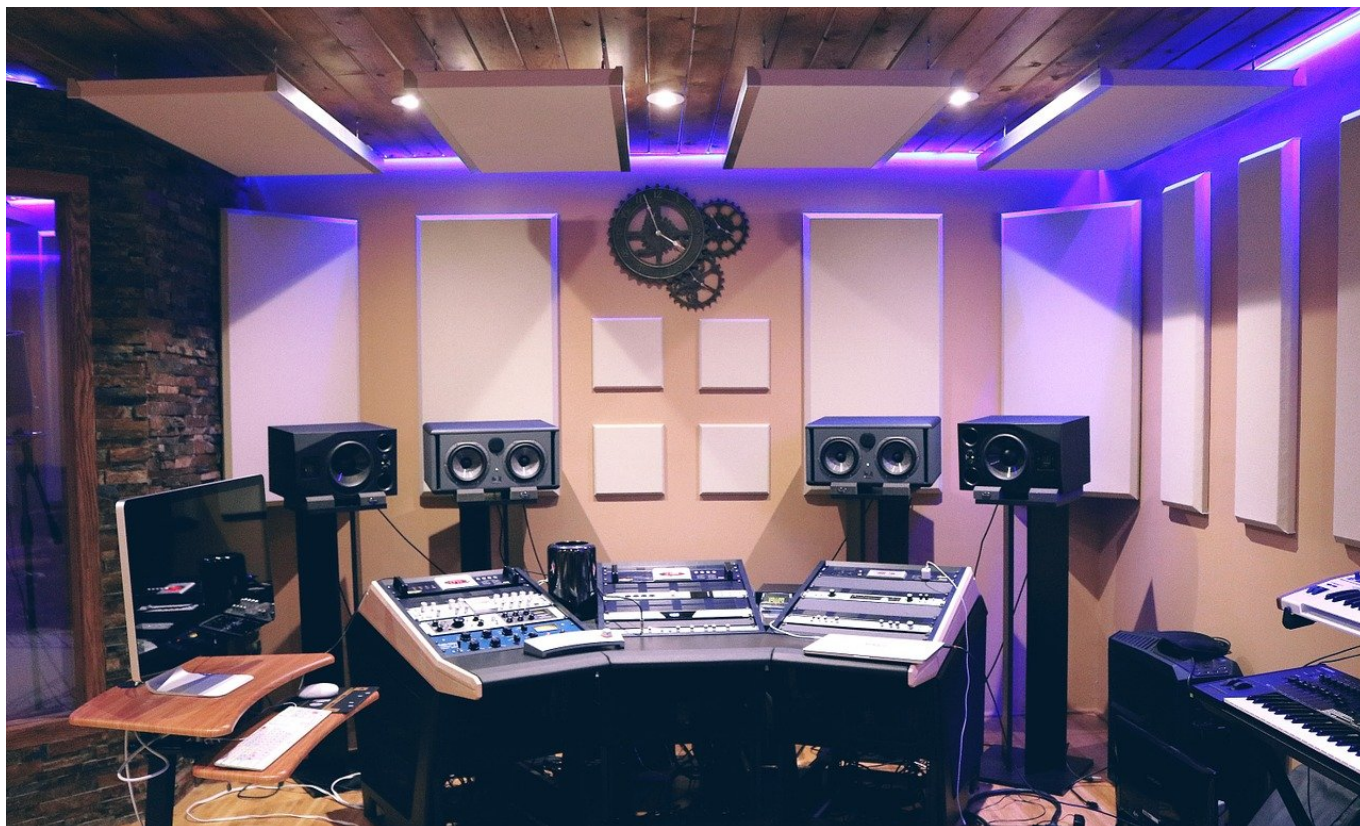

### Definitions of "Amplify" as a verb

- *Make (something) more marked or intense.*
- *Enlarge upon or add detail to (a story or statement).*
- *Exaggerate or make bigger.*
- *Increase in size, volume or significance.*
- *To enlarge beyond bounds or the truth.*
- *Increase the amplitude of (an electrical signal or other oscillation).*

<b>add flesh to</b>	Determine the sum of.
<b>add to</b>	Make an addition by combining numbers.
<b>augment</b>	Make (something) greater by adding to it; increase. <i>The pressure <b>augmented</b>.</i>
<b>blow up</b>	Make a sound as if blown.
<b>boost</b>	Give a boost to be beneficial to. <i>The tax cut will <b>boost</b> the economy.</i>
<b>concentrate</b>	Compress or concentrate. <i>Plants and microorganisms can <b>concentrate</b> metals from the environment.</i>
<b>develop</b>	Cause to grow and differentiate in ways conforming to its natural development. <i>Please <b>develop</b> this roll of film for me.</i>

<b>elaborate on</b>	Produce from basic elements or sources; change into a more developed product.
<b>embroider</b>	Add fictitious or exaggerated details to (an account) to make it more interesting. <i>She <b>embroidered</b> a tablecloth.</i>
<b>enlarge on</b>	Add details, as to an account or idea; clarify the meaning of and discourse in a learned way, usually in writing.
<u><b>escalate</b></u>	Increase in extent or intensity. <i>The price of tickets <b>escalated</b>.</i>
<u><b>exaggerate</b></u>	Represent (something) as being larger, better, or worse than it really is. <i>Tended to romanticize and <b>exaggerate</b> this gracious Old South imagery.</i>
<b>expand</b>	Expand the influence of. <i>The dough <b>expands</b>.</i>
<b>flesh out</b>	Remove adhering flesh from (hides) when preparing leather manufacture.
<b>go into detail about</b>	Be abolished or discarded.
<b>heighten</b>	Become more extreme. <i><b>Heighten</b> the tension.</i>
<b>hyperbolise</b>	To enlarge beyond bounds or the truth.
<b>hyperbolize</b>	Represent something as being larger, better, or worse than it really is; exaggerate. <i>Victims are prone to <b>hyperbolize</b> and invent details that just aren't there.</i>
<b>increase</b>	Become or make greater in size, amount, or degree. <i>The university <b>increased</b> the number of students it admitted.</i>
<b>inflate</b>	Become inflated. <i>The war <b>inflated</b> the economy.</i>
<u><b>intensify</b></u>	Become more intense. <i>The dispute began to <b>intensify</b>.</i>
<b>louden</b>	Make or become louder. <i>The latest research will <b>louden</b> the cries from critics.</i>
<u><b>magnify</b></u>	Make large. <i>Praise the Lord and <b>magnify</b> Him.</i>
<b>make louder</b>	Cause to do; cause to act in a specified manner.

<b>overdraw</b>	Exaggerate in describing or depicting (someone or something). <i>I m already <b>overdrawn</b> this month.</i>
<b>overstate</b>	To enlarge beyond bounds or the truth. <i>I <b>overstated</b> my case to make my point.</i>
<b>raise</b>	Raise from a lower to a higher position. <i>They managed to <b>raise</b> Hanoi last night.</i>
<b><u>reinforce</u></b>	Strengthen (a military force) with additional personnel or equipment. <i>The helmet has been <b>reinforced</b> with a double layer of cork.</i>
<b><u>sharpen</u></b>	Make crisp or more crisp and precise. <i>Her tone <b>sharpened</b>.</i>
<b>step up</b>	Cause (a computer) to execute a single command.
<b>strengthen</b>	Make strong or stronger. <i>He advises an application of fluoride to <b>strengthen</b> the teeth.</i>
<b>supplement</b>	Serve as a supplement to. <i>I looked for a part time job to <b>supplement</b> my income.</i>
<b>swell</b>	Cause to become swollen. <i>The mother was <b>swelling</b> with importance when she spoke of her son.</i>
<b>turn up</b>	Cause to move along an axis or into a new direction.

*He **augmented** his summer income by painting houses.*

### augmentation

The action or process of making or becoming greater in size or amount.

*The **augmentation** of the curriculum with new subjects.*

### bloat

Make bloated or swollen.

*The dead man's stomach was **bloated**.*

<b>broaden</b>	Make broader. <i><b>Broaden</b> the road.</i>
<b>dilate</b>	Add details, as to an account or idea; clarify the meaning of and discourse in a learned way, usually in writing. <i>The woman <b>dilated</b> her nostrils.</i>
<b>distend</b>	Swell or cause to swell by pressure from inside. <i>Air is introduced into the stomach to <b>distend</b> it.</i>
<b>diversify</b>	Vary in order to spread risk or to expand. <i>We re confident that the new owners will grow and <b>diversify</b> the company globally.</i>
<b>enlarge</b>	Become larger or bigger. <i>Very often a favourite photograph is <b>enlarged</b> and framed.</i>
<b>escalation</b>	An increase to counteract a perceived discrepancy. <i>There was a gradual <b>escalation</b> of hostilities.</i>
<b>expand</b>	Expand the influence of. <i>His business <b>expanded</b> rapidly.</i>
<b>expanded</b>	Relatively broad in shape. <i><b>Expanded</b> polystyrene.</i>
<b>expansion</b>	The action of becoming larger or more extensive. <i>The book is an <b>expansion</b> of a lecture given last year.</i>
<b>exponentially</b>	(with reference to an increase) more and more rapidly. <i>Our business has been growing <b>exponentially</b>.</i>
<b>extend</b>	Stretch out over a distance space time or scope run or extend between two points or beyond a certain point. <i>The law was <b>extended</b> to all citizens.</i>
<b>extension</b>	The action or process of enlarging or extending something. <i>The <b>extension</b> of satellite of Mars is the set containing only Demos and Phobos.</i>
<b>growing</b>	Biology the process of an individual organism growing organically a purely biological unfolding of events involved in an organism changing gradually from a simple to a more complex level. <i>The needs of the <b>growing</b> child.</i>
<b>increase</b>	The amount by which something increases. <i>We are aiming to <b>increase</b> awareness of social issues.</i>
<b>magnification</b>	The ratio of the size of an image to the size of the object. <i>This microscope should give a <b>magnification</b> of about 100.</i>

<b>maturation</b>	The process by which wine or other fermented drinks become ready for drinking. <i>Sexual <b>maturation</b>.</i>

<b>megaphone</b>	Utter through or as if through a megaphone. <i>The director stood around megaphoning orders.</i>
<b>pervasiveness</b>	The quality of spreading widely or being present throughout an area or a group of people. <i>The <b>pervasiveness</b> of the odor of cabbage in tenement hallways.</i>
<b>proliferate</b>	Grow rapidly. <i>Cultured cells often <b>proliferate</b> indefinitely.</i>
<b>rise</b>	Rise to one s feet. <i>The activists urged militant factions to <b>rise</b> up.</i>
<b>stretching</b>	Exercise designed to extend the limbs and muscles to their full extent.
<b>swell</b>	The undulating movement of the surface of the open sea. <i>She felt herself <b>swell</b> with pride.</i>
<b>widen</b>	Make or become wider. <i>The lane <b>widened</b> out into a small clearing.</i>
