## Anachronism as a Noun

### Definitions of "Anachronism" as a noun

According to the <u>Oxford Dictionary of English</u>, "anachronism" as a noun can have the following definitions:

- An artifact that belongs to another time.
- The action of attributing something to a period to which it does not belong.
- A person who seems to be displaced in time; who belongs to another age.
- Something located at a time when it could not have existed or occurred.
- A thing belonging or appropriate to a period other than that in which it exists, especially a thing that is conspicuously old-fashioned.





Synonyms of "Anachronism" as a noun (2 Words)

**misdating** Something located at a time when it could not have existed or occurred. **mistiming** Something located at a time when it could not have existed or occurred.





### Usage Examples of "Anachronism" as a noun

- It is anachronism to suppose that the official morality of the age was mere window dressing.
- The town is a throwback to medieval times, an anachronism that has survived the passing years.

# Associations of "Anachronism" (30 Words)

ambivalenceThe state of having mixed feelings or contradictory ideas about something<br/>or someone.<br/>The law s ambivalence about the importance of a victim s identity.

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atavism	Recurrence of traits of an ancestor in a subsequent generation. The more civilized a society seems to be the more susceptible it is to its buried <b>atavism</b> .
<u>back</u>	Related to or located at the back. The team was five points <b>back</b> .
backslide	Relapse into bad ways or error. There are many things that can cause slimmers to <b>backslide</b> .
backward	In a manner or order or direction the reverse of normal. <i>The child put her jersey on</i> <b>backward</b> .
backwards	At or to or toward the back or rear. Count <b>backwards</b> from twenty to ten.
conflicting	In disagreement- John Morley. <i>Conflicting</i> opinions.
<u>contradiction</u>	A situation in which inconsistent elements are present. <i>He spoke as if he thought his claims were immune to <b>contradiction</b>.</i>
<u>contradictory</u>	A contradictory proposition. Perfect and imperfect are <b>contradictory</b> terms.
<u>contrary</u>	A contrary proposition. His mother had given him <b>contrary</b> messages.
<u>converse</u>	Of words so related that one reverses the relation denoted by the other. <i>Parental and filial are converse terms.</i>
degeneration	The state or process of being or becoming degenerate; decline or deterioration. Overgrazing has caused serious <b>degeneration</b> of grassland.
<u>inconsistency</u>	An inconsistent aspect or element. The <b>inconsistency</b> between his expressed attitudes and his actual behaviour.
inverse	Something inverted in sequence or character or effect. When the direct approach failed he tried the <b>inverse</b> .
opposing	(of two or more subjects) differing from or in conflict with each other. On the <b>opposing</b> page there were two addresses.
<u>oxymoron</u>	Conjoining contradictory terms (as in `deafening silence.
<u>paradox</u>	A statement that contradicts itself. The uncertainty principle leads to all sorts of <b>paradox</b> es like the particles being in two places at once.



<u>paradoxical</u>	Seemingly absurd or self-contradictory. By glorifying the acts of violence they achieve the <b>paradoxical</b> effect of making them trivial.
<u>regress</u>	Calculate the coefficient or coefficients of regression of a variable against or on another variable. I <b>regress</b> ed Sylvia to early childhood.
regression	An abnormal state in which development has stopped prematurely. The details recalled by Carol during the <b>regression</b> .
regressive	Adjusted so that the rate decreases as the amount of income increases. <i>A <b>regressive</b> personality.</i>
<u>relapse</u>	(of a sick or injured person) deteriorate after a period of improvement. <i>He <b>relapse</b>d into silence.</i>
retreat	Make a retreat from an earlier commitment or activity. <i>After the funeral he</i> <b>retreat</b> ed to Scotland.
retrograde	Show retrograde motion. <i>Retrograde</i> arguments.
retrogression	Passing from a more complex to a simpler biological form. A <b>retrogression</b> to 19th century attitudes.
<u>retrospect</u>	Look back upon (a period of time, sequence of events); remember. In <b>retrospect</b> .
retrospective	Concerned with or related to the past. A Georgia O Keeffe <b>retrospective</b> .
reversal	A change from one state to the opposite state. The <b>reversal</b> of tidal currents.
reversion	A property to which someone has the right of reversion. He was given a promise of the <b>reversion</b> of Boraston s job.
<u>throwback</u>	Characteristic of an atavist. The eyes could be an ancestral <b>throwback</b> .
