## Associations of "Analgesic" (30 Words)

### [allergy](#)

Hypersensitivity reaction to a particular allergen; symptoms can vary greatly in intensity.

*Their **allergy** to free enterprise.*

### [anodyne](#)

Capable of relieving pain.

*The **anodyne** properties of certain drugs.*

### **antihistamine**

A medicine used to treat allergies and hypersensitive reactions and colds; works by counteracting the effects of histamine on a receptor site.

*An **antihistamine** injection.*

### **antispasmodic**

An antispasmodic drug.

### **aspirin**

The acetylated derivative of salicylic acid; used as an analgesic anti-inflammatory drug (trade names Bayer, Empirin, and St. Joseph) usually taken in tablet form; used as an antipyretic; slows clotting of the blood by poisoning platelets.

<b>capsule</b>	Enclose in a capsule. <i>A <b>capsule</b> wardrobe.</i>
<b>downer</b>	A cow or other animal that has fallen down and cannot get to its feet unaided. <i>During that week I was heavily doped on <b>downers</b>.</i>
<b>drug</b>	Administer a drug to. <i>A new <b>drug</b> aimed at sufferers from Parkinson s disease.</i>
<b>effect</b>	A physical phenomenon, typically named after its discoverer. <i><b>Effect</b> a change.</i>
<b>hypnotic</b>	Exerting a compelling or soporific effect. <i>Read the bedtime story in a <b>hypnotic</b> voice.</i>
<b>medication</b>	(medicine) something that treats or prevents or alleviates the symptoms of disease. <i>He was given <b>medication</b> for pain.</i>
<b>medicinal</b>	A medicinal substance. <i><b>Medicinal</b> herbs.</i>
<b>moderating</b>	Lessening in intensity or strength.
<b><u>moderation</u></b>	The action or process of moderating examination papers, results, or candidates. <i>Coursework may need to be filed separately for the purposes of <b>moderation</b>.</i>
<b>narcotic</b>	Of or relating to or designating narcotics. <i>The substance has a mild <b>narcotic</b> effect.</i>
<b>overdose</b>	Give an overdose to. <i>A fatal <b>overdose</b> of painkillers.</i>
<b>painkiller</b>	A medicine used to relieve pain.
<b>pharmacology</b>	The branch of medicine concerned with the uses, effects, and modes of action of drugs.
<b>pill</b>	A contraceptive in the form of a pill containing estrogen and progesterin to inhibit ovulation and so prevent conception. <i>Is she on the <b>pill</b>.</i>
<b>placebo</b>	(Roman Catholic Church) vespers of the office for the dead. <i>Pacified by the <b>placebos</b> of the previous year they claimed a moral victory.</i>
<b>prescription</b>	Available only with a doctor s written prescription. <i>I ve got to pick up my <b>prescription</b> from the chemist s.</i>

<b>relaxant</b>	Tending to relax or relieve muscular or nervous tension. <i>A <b>relaxant</b> drug.</i>
<b>sedative</b>	Tending to soothe or tranquilize. <i>She won't let them give her <b>sedatives</b> because of the baby.</i>
<b>soothe</b>	Give moral or emotional strength to. <i>The medicine <b>soothes</b> the pain of the inflammation.</i>
<b><u>soporific</u></b>	Sleep inducing. <i>A libel trial is in large parts intensely <b>soporific</b>.</i>
<b>stimulant</b>	That stimulates. <i>Caffeine has <b>stimulant</b> effects on the heart.</i>
<b><u>tablet</u></b>	A flat slab of stone, clay, or wood, used especially for an inscription. <i>A <b>tablet</b> of soap.</i>
<b><u>trance</u></b>	Put into a trance. <i>She put him into a light <b>trance</b>.</i>
<b>tranquilizer</b>	A drug used to reduce stress or tension without reducing mental clarity.
<b>uninteresting</b>	Arousing no interest or attention or curiosity or excitement. <i>A very <b>uninteresting</b> account of her trip.</i>
