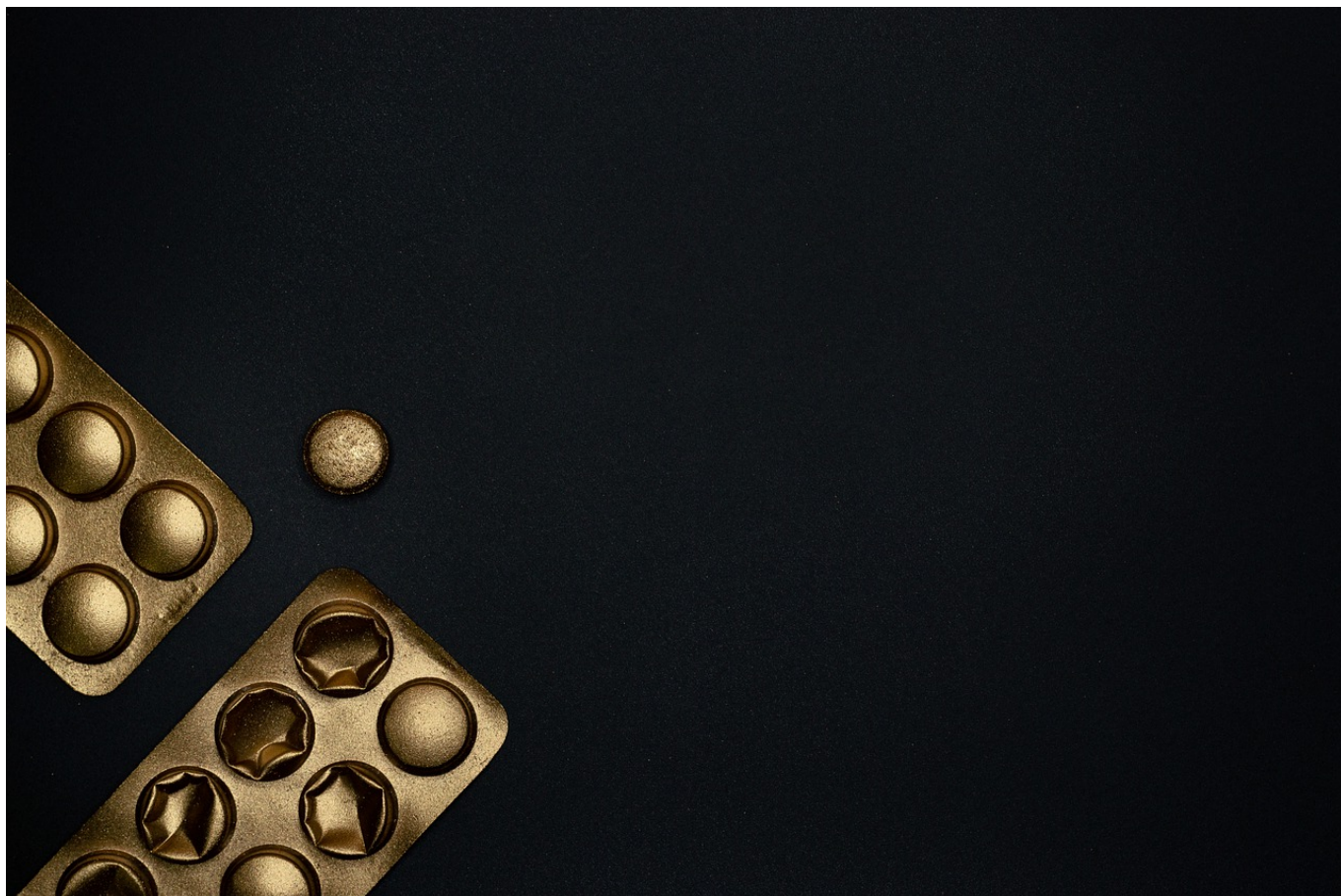

A drug or a medicine for relieving pain.

painkilling drug A substance that is used as a medicine or narcotic.

Associations of "Analgesic" (30 Words)

allergy

Hypersensitivity reaction to a particular allergen; symptoms can vary greatly in intensity.

*Their **allergy** to free enterprise.*

anodyne

Capable of relieving pain.

*The **anodyne** properties of certain drugs.*

antihistamine

A medicine used to treat allergies and hypersensitive reactions and colds; works by counteracting the effects of histamine on a receptor site.

*An **antihistamine** injection.*

antispasmodic

An antispasmodic drug.

aspirin

The acetylated derivative of salicylic acid; used as an analgesic anti-inflammatory drug (trade names Bayer, Empirin, and St. Joseph) usually taken in tablet form; used as an antipyretic; slows clotting of the blood by poisoning platelets.

capsule	Enclose in a capsule. <i>A capsule wardrobe.</i>
downer	A cow or other animal that has fallen down and cannot get to its feet unaided. <i>During that week I was heavily doped on downers.</i>
drug	Administer a drug to. <i>A new drug aimed at sufferers from Parkinson s disease.</i>
effect	A physical phenomenon, typically named after its discoverer. <i>Effect a change.</i>
hypnotic	Exerting a compelling or soporific effect. <i>Read the bedtime story in a hypnotic voice.</i>
medication	(medicine) something that treats or prevents or alleviates the symptoms of disease. <i>He was given medication for pain.</i>
medicinal	A medicinal substance. <i>Medicinal herbs.</i>
moderating	Lessening in intensity or strength.
<u>moderation</u>	The action or process of moderating examination papers, results, or candidates. <i>Coursework may need to be filed separately for the purposes of moderation.</i>
narcotic	Of or relating to or designating narcotics. <i>The substance has a mild narcotic effect.</i>
overdose	Give an overdose to. <i>A fatal overdose of painkillers.</i>
painkiller	A medicine used to relieve pain.
pharmacology	The branch of medicine concerned with the uses, effects, and modes of action of drugs.
pill	A contraceptive in the form of a pill containing estrogen and progestin to inhibit ovulation and so prevent conception. <i>Is she on the pill.</i>
placebo	(Roman Catholic Church) vespers of the office for the dead. <i>Pacified by the placebos of the previous year they claimed a moral victory.</i>
prescription	Available only with a doctor s written prescription. <i>I ve got to pick up my prescription from the chemist s.</i>

relaxant	Tending to relax or relieve muscular or nervous tension. <i>A relaxant drug.</i>
sedative	Tending to soothe or tranquilize. <i>She won't let them give her sedatives because of the baby.</i>
soothe	Give moral or emotional strength to. <i>The medicine soothes the pain of the inflammation.</i>
<u>soporific</u>	Sleep inducing. <i>A libel trial is in large parts intensely soporific.</i>
stimulant	That stimulates. <i>Caffeine has stimulant effects on the heart.</i>
<u>tablet</u>	A flat slab of stone, clay, or wood, used especially for an inscription. <i>A tablet of soap.</i>
<u>trance</u>	Put into a trance. <i>She put him into a light trance.</i>
tranquilizer	A drug used to reduce stress or tension without reducing mental clarity.
uninteresting	Arousing no interest or attention or curiosity or excitement. <i>A very uninteresting account of her trip.</i>
