## Synonyms of "Anarchist" as a noun (14 Words)

agitator	An apparatus for stirring liquid. A political <b>agitator</b> .
bolshevik	A Russian member of the left-wing majority group that followed Lenin and eventually became the Russian communist party.
freedom fighter	Immunity from an obligation or duty.
guerrilla	A member of an irregular armed force that fights a stronger force by sabotage and harassment. <i>Guerrilla</i> warfare.
insurgent	A person who takes part in an armed rebellion against the constituted authority (especially in the hope of improving conditions. <i>An attack by armed insurgents.</i>



mutineer	Someone who is openly rebellious and refuses to obey authorities (especially seamen or soldiers. <i>Those who resisted were denounced as mutineers and treated</i> <i>accordingly.</i>
nihilist	An advocate of anarchism. It is impossible to argue against a <b>nihilist</b> .
<u>rebel</u>	A person who takes part in an armed rebellion against the constituted authority especially in the hope of improving conditions. <i>Rebel</i> forces.
resistance fighter	A material's opposition to the flow of electric current; measured in ohms.
<u>revolutionary</u>	A radical supporter of political or social revolution.
revolutionist	A radical supporter of political or social revolution.
<u>subversive</u>	A subversive person. The government claimed we were <b>subversive</b> s or terrorists.
syndicalist	An advocate of anarchism.
<u>terrorist</u>	A radical who employs terror as a political weapon usually organizes with other terrorists in small cells often uses religion as a cover for terrorist activities. <i>A suspected terrorist</i> .

## Associations of "Anarchist" (30 Words)

<u>anarchy</u>	The organization of society on the basis of voluntary cooperation, without political institutions or hierarchical government; anarchism. <i>He must ensure public order in a country threatened with <b>anarchy</b>.</i>
<u>bourgeois</u>	A bourgeois person. A self confessed and proud <b>bourgeois</b> .
<u>businessman</u>	A person engaged in commercial or industrial business (especially an owner or executive.
<u>capitalism</u>	An economic and political system in which a country's trade and industry are controlled by private owners for profit, rather than by the state. <i>Private ownership is a key feature of capitalism</i> .
capitalist	Of or relating to capitalism or capitalists. The creation of the factory system by nineteenth century <b>capitalist</b> s.



chaos	The most ancient of gods; the personification of the infinity of space preceding creation of the universe. Snow caused <b>chaos</b> in the region.
<u>chaotic</u>	In a state of complete confusion and disorder. The political situation was <b>chaotic</b> .
<u>communism</u>	A political theory favoring collectivism in a classless society.
<u>communist</u>	A member of the communist party. <i>Communist</i> ic propaganda.
competitive	Involving competition or competitiveness. <i>To improve one s <b>competitive</b> position.</i>
corporate	A corporate company or group. An in <b>corporate</b> d town.
decentralize	Move departments of (a large organization) away from a single administrative centre to other locations. <i>New technology allows companies to <b>decentralize</b> large factories.</i>
democracy	A state governed under a system of democracy. <i>Demands for greater <b>democracy</b>.</i>
democratic	(in the US) relating to the Democratic Party. A <b>democratic</b> or popular movement.
<u>empty</u>	Make void or empty of contents. An <b>empty</b> room.
entrepreneur	Someone who organizes a business venture and assumes the risk for it. <i>Many entrepreneurs see potential in this market.</i>
fascism	A political theory advocating an authoritarian hierarchical government (as opposed to democracy or liberalism. <i>This is yet another example of health</i> <b>fascism</b> <i>in action.</i>
freemason	A member of a widespread secret fraternal order pledged to mutual assistance and brotherly love.
<u>liberal</u>	(especially of an interpretation of a law) broadly construed or understood; not strictly literal or exact. A <b>liberal</b> backer of the arts.
libertarian	An advocate of libertarianism. <i>No true <b>libertarian</b> would ever support a culture where citizens must show their papers to travel.</i>
materialistic	Excessively concerned with material possessions; money-oriented. We re living in a highly <b>materialistic</b> society.



mess	Have one s meals with a particular person especially as a member of an armed forces mess. She scratched her head <b>mess</b> ing her hair still further.
nihilist	A supporter of an extreme Russian revolutionary party c.1900 which found nothing to approve of in the established social order. <i>It is impossible to argue against a <b>nihilist</b>.</i>
none	Not any. It is made <b>none</b> the easier by the differences in approach.
<u>pessimist</u>	A person who believes that this world is as bad as it could be or that evil will ultimately prevail over good. <i>He finds solace in the writings of</i> <b>pessimist</b> <i>philosophers.</i>
<u>politician</u>	A person who acts in a manipulative and devious way, typically to gain advancement within an organization. A local <b>politician</b> .
<u>proletariat</u>	Working-class people regarded collectively (often used with reference to Marxism. The growth of the industrial <b>proletariat</b> .
socialist	Advocating or following the socialist principles. She was a lifelong <b>socialist</b> .
totalitarianism	The principle of complete and unrestricted power in government. Democratic countries were fighting against <b>totalitarianism</b> .
<u>utopia</u>	A work of fiction describing a utopia. Misplaced faith in political <b>utopia</b> s has led to ruin.
