agitator	An apparatus for stirring liquid. <i>A political agitator.</i>
bolshevik	A Russian member of the left-wing majority group that followed Lenin and eventually became the Russian communist party.
freedom fighter	Immunity from an obligation or duty.
guerrilla	A member of an irregular armed force that fights a stronger force by sabotage and harassment. <i>Guerrilla warfare.</i>
insurgent	A person who takes part in an armed rebellion against the constituted authority (especially in the hope of improving conditions). <i>An attack by armed insurgents.</i>

mutineer	Someone who is openly rebellious and refuses to obey authorities (especially seamen or soldiers). <i>Those who resisted were denounced as mutineers and treated accordingly.</i>
nihilist	An advocate of anarchism. <i>It is impossible to argue against a nihilist.</i>
rebel	A person who takes part in an armed rebellion against the constituted authority especially in the hope of improving conditions. <i>Rebel forces.</i>
resistance fighter	A material's opposition to the flow of electric current; measured in ohms.
revolutionary	A radical supporter of political or social revolution.
revolutionist	A radical supporter of political or social revolution.
subversive	A subversive person. <i>The government claimed we were subversives or terrorists.</i>
syndicalist	An advocate of anarchism.
terrorist	A radical who employs terror as a political weapon usually organizes with other terrorists in small cells often uses religion as a cover for terrorist activities. <i>A suspected terrorist.</i>

Associations of "Anarchist" (30 Words)

anarchy	The organization of society on the basis of voluntary cooperation, without political institutions or hierarchical government; anarchism. <i>He must ensure public order in a country threatened with anarchy.</i>
bourgeois	A bourgeois person. <i>A self confessed and proud bourgeois.</i>
businessman	A person engaged in commercial or industrial business (especially an owner or executive).
capitalism	An economic and political system in which a country's trade and industry are controlled by private owners for profit, rather than by the state. <i>Private ownership is a key feature of capitalism.</i>
capitalist	Of or relating to capitalism or capitalists. <i>The creation of the factory system by nineteenth century capitalists.</i>

chaos	The most ancient of gods; the personification of the infinity of space preceding creation of the universe. <i>Snow caused chaos in the region.</i>
<u>chaotic</u>	In a state of complete confusion and disorder. <i>The political situation was chaotic.</i>
<u>communism</u>	A political theory favoring collectivism in a classless society.
<u>communist</u>	A member of the communist party. <i>Communistic propaganda.</i>
competitive	Involving competition or competitiveness. <i>To improve one's competitive position.</i>
corporate	A corporate company or group. <i>An incorporated town.</i>
decentralize	Move departments of (a large organization) away from a single administrative centre to other locations. <i>New technology allows companies to decentralize large factories.</i>
democracy	A state governed under a system of democracy. <i>Demands for greater democracy.</i>
democratic	(in the US) relating to the Democratic Party. <i>A democratic or popular movement.</i>
<u>empty</u>	Make void or empty of contents. <i>An empty room.</i>
entrepreneur	Someone who organizes a business venture and assumes the risk for it. <i>Many entrepreneurs see potential in this market.</i>
fascism	A political theory advocating an authoritarian hierarchical government (as opposed to democracy or liberalism). <i>This is yet another example of health fascism in action.</i>
freemason	A member of a widespread secret fraternal order pledged to mutual assistance and brotherly love.
<u>liberal</u>	(especially of an interpretation of a law) broadly construed or understood; not strictly literal or exact. <i>A liberal backer of the arts.</i>
libertarian	An advocate of libertarianism. <i>No true libertarian would ever support a culture where citizens must show their papers to travel.</i>
materialistic	Excessively concerned with material possessions; money-oriented. <i>We're living in a highly materialistic society.</i>

mess	Have one's meals with a particular person especially as a member of an armed force's mess. <i>She scratched her head messing her hair still further.</i>
nihilist	A supporter of an extreme Russian revolutionary party c.1900 which found nothing to approve of in the established social order. <i>It is impossible to argue against a nihilist.</i>
none	Not any. <i>It is made none the easier by the differences in approach.</i>
pessimist	A person who believes that this world is as bad as it could be or that evil will ultimately prevail over good. <i>He finds solace in the writings of pessimist philosophers.</i>
politician	A person who acts in a manipulative and devious way, typically to gain advancement within an organization. <i>A local politician.</i>
proletariat	Working-class people regarded collectively (often used with reference to Marxism). <i>The growth of the industrial proletariat.</i>
socialist	Advocating or following the socialist principles. <i>She was a lifelong socialist.</i>
totalitarianism	The principle of complete and unrestricted power in government. <i>Democratic countries were fighting against totalitarianism.</i>
utopia	A work of fiction describing a utopia. <i>Misplaced faith in political utopias has led to ruin.</i>
