## Synonyms of "Anarchist" as a noun (14 Words)

<b>agitator</b>	An apparatus for stirring liquid. <i>A political <b>agitator</b>.</i>
<b>bolshevik</b>	A Russian member of the left-wing majority group that followed Lenin and eventually became the Russian communist party.
<b>freedom fighter</b>	Immunity from an obligation or duty.
<b>guerrilla</b>	A member of an irregular armed force that fights a stronger force by sabotage and harassment. <i><b>Guerrilla</b> warfare.</i>
<b>insurgent</b>	A person who takes part in an armed rebellion against the constituted authority (especially in the hope of improving conditions). <i>An attack by armed <b>insurgents</b>.</i>

<b>mutineer</b>	Someone who is openly rebellious and refuses to obey authorities (especially seamen or soldiers). <i>Those who resisted were denounced as <b>mutineers</b> and treated accordingly.</i>
<b>nihilist</b>	An advocate of anarchism. <i>It is impossible to argue against a <b>nihilist</b>.</i>
<b>rebel</b>	A person who takes part in an armed rebellion against the constituted authority especially in the hope of improving conditions. <i><b>Rebel</b> forces.</i>
<b>resistance fighter</b>	A material's opposition to the flow of electric current; measured in ohms.
<b>revolutionary</b>	A radical supporter of political or social revolution.
<b>revolutionist</b>	A radical supporter of political or social revolution.
<b>subversive</b>	A subversive person. <i>The government claimed we were <b>subversives</b> or terrorists.</i>
<b>syndicalist</b>	An advocate of anarchism.
<b>terrorist</b>	A radical who employs terror as a political weapon usually organizes with other terrorists in small cells often uses religion as a cover for terrorist activities. <i>A suspected <b>terrorist</b>.</i>

## Associations of "Anarchist" (30 Words)

<b>anarchy</b>	The organization of society on the basis of voluntary cooperation, without political institutions or hierarchical government; anarchism. <i>He must ensure public order in a country threatened with <b>anarchy</b>.</i>
<b>bourgeois</b>	A bourgeois person. <i>A self confessed and proud <b>bourgeois</b>.</i>
<b>businessman</b>	A person engaged in commercial or industrial business (especially an owner or executive).
<b>capitalism</b>	An economic and political system in which a country's trade and industry are controlled by private owners for profit, rather than by the state. <i>Private ownership is a key feature of <b>capitalism</b>.</i>
<b>capitalist</b>	Of or relating to capitalism or capitalists. <i>The creation of the factory system by nineteenth century <b>capitalists</b>.</i>

<b>chaos</b>	The most ancient of gods; the personification of the infinity of space preceding creation of the universe. <i>Snow caused <b>chaos</b> in the region.</i>
<b><u>chaotic</u></b>	In a state of complete confusion and disorder. <i>The political situation was <b>chaotic</b>.</i>
<b><u>communism</u></b>	A political theory favoring collectivism in a classless society.
<b><u>communist</u></b>	A member of the communist party. <i><b>Communistic</b> propaganda.</i>
<b>competitive</b>	Involving competition or competitiveness. <i>To improve one's <b>competitive</b> position.</i>
<b>corporate</b>	A corporate company or group. <i>An <b>incorporated</b> town.</i>
<b>decentralize</b>	Move departments of (a large organization) away from a single administrative centre to other locations. <i>New technology allows companies to <b>decentralize</b> large factories.</i>
<b>democracy</b>	A state governed under a system of democracy. <i>Demands for greater <b>democracy</b>.</i>
<b>democratic</b>	(in the US) relating to the Democratic Party. <i>A <b>democratic</b> or popular movement.</i>
<b><u>empty</u></b>	Make void or empty of contents. <i>An <b>empty</b> room.</i>
<b>entrepreneur</b>	Someone who organizes a business venture and assumes the risk for it. <i>Many <b>entrepreneurs</b> see potential in this market.</i>
<b>fascism</b>	A political theory advocating an authoritarian hierarchical government (as opposed to democracy or liberalism). <i>This is yet another example of health <b>fascism</b> in action.</i>
<b>freemason</b>	A member of a widespread secret fraternal order pledged to mutual assistance and brotherly love.
<b><u>liberal</u></b>	(especially of an interpretation of a law) broadly construed or understood; not strictly literal or exact. <i>A <b>liberal</b> backer of the arts.</i>
<b>libertarian</b>	An advocate of libertarianism. <i>No true <b>libertarian</b> would ever support a culture where citizens must show their papers to travel.</i>
<b>materialistic</b>	Excessively concerned with material possessions; money-oriented. <i>We're living in a highly <b>materialistic</b> society.</i>

<b>mess</b>	Have one's meals with a particular person especially as a member of an armed force's mess. <i>She scratched her head <b>messing</b> her hair still further.</i>
<b>nihilist</b>	A supporter of an extreme Russian revolutionary party c.1900 which found nothing to approve of in the established social order. <i>It is impossible to argue against a <b>nihilist</b>.</i>
<u><b>none</b></u>	Not any. <i>It is made <b>none</b> the easier by the differences in approach.</i>
<u><b>pessimist</b></u>	A person who believes that this world is as bad as it could be or that evil will ultimately prevail over good. <i>He finds solace in the writings of <b>pessimist</b> philosophers.</i>
<u><b>politician</b></u>	A person who acts in a manipulative and devious way, typically to gain advancement within an organization. <i>A local <b>politician</b>.</i>
<u><b>proletariat</b></u>	Working-class people regarded collectively (often used with reference to Marxism). <i>The growth of the industrial <b>proletariat</b>.</i>
<b>socialist</b>	Advocating or following the socialist principles. <i>She was a lifelong <b>socialist</b>.</i>
<b>totalitarianism</b>	The principle of complete and unrestricted power in government. <i>Democratic countries were fighting against <b>totalitarianism</b>.</i>
<u><b>utopia</b></u>	A work of fiction describing a utopia. <i>Misplaced faith in political <b>utopias</b> has led to ruin.</i>
