blanch	Cook (vegetables) briefly. <i>The cold light <b>blanch</b>ed her face.</i>
breakable	An article that is fragile and easily broken. An encrypted password isn t easily <b>breakable</b> .
<u>brittle</u>	A brittle sweet made from nuts and set melted sugar. <i>Her manner was artificially bright and <b>brittle</b>.</i>
debilitated	Lacking energy or vitality. A <b>debilitated</b> patient.
<u>decrepit</u>	Worn out or ruined because of age or neglect. A rather <b>decrepit</b> old man.
<u>emaciated</u>	Abnormally thin or weak, especially because of illness or a lack of food. She was so <b>emaciated</b> she could hardly stand.
emaciation	The state of being abnormally thin or weak. Thin to the point of <b>emaciation</b> .
feminine	A feminine word or form. A <b>feminine</b> ending.
flagging	Weak from exhaustion. She wants to revive her <b>flagging</b> career.
<u>fragile</u>	(of an object) easily broken or damaged. A small <b>fragile</b> old lady.
fragility	The quality of being delicate or vulnerable. A film about the <b>fragility</b> of relationships.
<u>frail</u>	The weight of a frail basket full of raisins or figs between 50 and 75 pounds. <i>An invalid s frail body.</i>
<u>ill</u>	Presaging ill fortune P B Shelley. She could <b>ill</b> afford the cost of new curtains.
impotent	(of a male animal) unable to copulate. <i>He was seized with an <b>impotent</b> anger.</i>
infirm	Not physically or mentally strong, especially through age or illness. <i>Infirm</i> of purpose give me the daggers.
languish	Pine with love or grief. He has been <b>languish</b> ing in jail since 1974.
<u>limp</u>	A tendency to limp a gait impeded by injury or stiffness. He <b>limp</b> ed off during Saturday s game.
<u>pale</u>	Become pale in one s face from shock or fear. <b>Pale</b> blue eyes.



pallid	(of light) lacking in intensity or brightness; dim or feeble. <i>The <b>pallid</b> face of the invalid.</i>
powerless	Without ability, influence, or power. Troops were <b>powerless</b> to stop last night s shooting.
puny	Poor in quality, amount, or size. The army was reduced to a <b>puny</b> 100 000 men.
rickety	Affected with, suffering from, or characteristic of rickets. A <b>rickety</b> table.
sick	People who are sick. They devote their lives to caring for the <b>sick</b> .
spineless	Weak in willpower, courage or vitality. <i>Spineless</i> forms of prickly pear have been selected.
undermine	Lessen the effectiveness, power, or ability of, especially gradually or insidiously. The demolition engineers did eventually <b>undermine</b> two of the towers six sides.
<u>vulnerable</u>	(of a person) in need of special care, support, or protection because of age, disability, or risk of abuse or neglect. The scheme will help charities working with <b>vulnerable</b> adults and young people.
<u>wan</u>	Lacking in intensity or brightness; dim or feeble. <i>He gave a <b>wan</b> smile.</i>
<u>weak</u>	Relating to or denoting the weakest of the known kinds of force between particles which acts only at distances less than about 10 cm is very much weaker than the electromagnetic and the strong interactions and conserves neither strangeness parity nor isospin. <i>A weak mind.</i>
weakly	Sickly; not robust. She leaned <b>weakly</b> against the wall.
