callous	Make insensitive or callous deaden feelings or morals. <i>With a workman s callous hands.</i>
cold	Of a person feeling uncomfortably cold. <i>Come in out of the cold.</i>

coldness	A lack of affection or enthusiasm. <i>The bitter coldness of the British weather.</i>
emotionless	Unmoved by feeling-Margaret Deland. <i>He kept his emotionless objectivity and faith in the cause he served.</i>
freezing	The freezing point of water 0 C. <i>He was freezing and miserable.</i>
frigid	Sexually unresponsive. <i>A frigid greeting.</i>
frostbitten	Injured by freezing or partial freezing. <i>Frostbitten fingers.</i>
frosty	(of the weather) very cold, with frost forming on surfaces. <i>A frosty glass.</i>
frozen	Incapable of being changed or moved or undone; e.g. <i>Frozen wastes.</i>
gelid	Extremely cold. <i>She gave a gelid reply.</i>
glacial	A glacial period. <i>His glacial blue eyes.</i>
hypothermia	The condition of having an abnormally (typically dangerously) low body temperature. <i>She was suffering from hypothermia.</i>
icy	Shiny and slick as with a thin coating of ice. <i>Icy stare.</i>
indifference	The trait of lacking enthusiasm for or interest in things generally. <i>The indifference of Chelsea s midfield.</i>
indifferent	Not good; fairly bad. <i>He gave an indifferent shrug.</i>
influenza	An acute febrile highly contagious viral disease.
insensate	Lacking sympathy or compassion; unfeeling. <i>A positively insensate hatred.</i>
insensible	Unresponsive to stimulation. <i>He lay insensible where he had fallen.</i>
insensitive	Showing or feeling no concern for others' feelings. <i>She was remarkably insensitive to pain.</i>
numb	Make numb or insensitive. <i>Vodka might numb the pain in my hand.</i>

operation	Psychology the performance of some composite cognitive activity an operation that affects mental contents. <i>Certain machine tool operations.</i>
paralyzed	Affected with paralysis.
rime	Frost formed on cold objects by the rapid freezing of water vapour in cloud or fog. <i>The rime was thick and crisp on the grass.</i>
senseless	Lacking common sense; wildly foolish. <i>Drugged and senseless.</i>
sleet	A thin coating of ice formed by sleet or rain freezing on coming into contact with a cold surface. <i>It was sleeting so hard we could barely see.</i>
standoffish	Lacking cordiality; unfriendly. <i>A standoffish manner.</i>
unconscious	Not conscious; lacking awareness and the capacity for sensory perception as if asleep or dead. <i>What is it he said again unconscious of the repetition.</i>
wintry	Characteristic of or occurring in winter. <i>Suffered severe wintry weather.</i>
