<b>emotionless</b>	Unmoved by feeling-Margaret Deland. <i>He kept his <b>emotionless</b> objectivity and faith in the cause he served.</i>
<b>freezing</b>	The freezing point of water 0 C. <i>He was <b>freezing</b> and miserable.</i>
<b>frigid</b>	Sexually unresponsive. <i>A <b>frigid</b> greeting.</i>
<b>frostbitten</b>	Injured by freezing or partial freezing. <i><b>Frostbitten</b> fingers.</i>
<b>frosty</b>	(of the weather) very cold, with frost forming on surfaces. <i>A <b>frosty</b> glass.</i>
<b>frozen</b>	Incapable of being changed or moved or undone; e.g. <i><b>Frozen</b> wastes.</i>
<b>gelid</b>	Extremely cold. <i>She gave a <b>gelid</b> reply.</i>
<b>glacial</b>	A glacial period. <i>His <b>glacial</b> blue eyes.</i>
<b>hypothermia</b>	The condition of having an abnormally (typically dangerously) low body temperature. <i>She was suffering from <b>hypothermia</b>.</i>
<b>icy</b>	Shiny and slick as with a thin coating of ice. <i><b>Icy</b> stare.</i>
<b>indifference</b>	The trait of lacking enthusiasm for or interest in things generally. <i>The <b>indifference</b> of Chelsea s midfield.</i>
<b>indifferent</b>	Not good; fairly bad. <i>He gave an <b>indifferent</b> shrug.</i>
<b>influenza</b>	An acute febrile highly contagious viral disease.
<b>insensate</b>	Lacking sympathy or compassion; unfeeling. <i>A positively <b>insensate</b> hatred.</i>
<b>insensible</b>	Unresponsive to stimulation. <i>He lay <b>insensible</b> where he had fallen.</i>
<b>insensitive</b>	Showing or feeling no concern for others' feelings. <i>She was remarkably <b>insensitive</b> to pain.</i>
<b>numb</b>	Make numb or insensitive. <i>Vodka might <b>numb</b> the pain in my hand.</i>

<b>operation</b>	Psychology the performance of some composite cognitive activity an operation that affects mental contents. <i>Certain machine tool <b>operations</b>.</i>
<b>paralyzed</b>	Affected with paralysis.
<b>rime</b>	Frost formed on cold objects by the rapid freezing of water vapour in cloud or fog. <i>The <b>rime</b> was thick and crisp on the grass.</i>
<b>senseless</b>	Lacking common sense; wildly foolish. <i>Drugged and <b>senseless</b>.</i>
<b>sleet</b>	A thin coating of ice formed by sleet or rain freezing on coming into contact with a cold surface. <i>It was <b>sleeting</b> so hard we could barely see.</i>
<b>standoffish</b>	Lacking cordiality; unfriendly. <i>A <b>standoffish</b> manner.</i>
<b>unconscious</b>	Not conscious; lacking awareness and the capacity for sensory perception as if asleep or dead. <i>What is it he said again <b>unconscious</b> of the repetition.</i>
<b>wintry</b>	Characteristic of or occurring in winter. <i>Suffered severe <b>wintry</b> weather.</i>
