Definitions of "Anew" as an adverb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “anew” as an adverb can have the following definitions:

- *Once more; again.*
- *In a new or different and typically more positive way.*
- *Again but in a new or different way.*



Synonyms of "Anew" as an adverb (6 Words)

a second time In the second place.

afresh In a new or different way.
*She left the job to start **afresh**.*

again Used to ask someone to repeat something.
*He rose tidied the bed and sat down **again**.*

once again At a previous time.

once more At a previous time.

over again Beyond the top or upper surface or edge; forward from an upright position.



Usage Examples of "Anew" as an adverb

- *Starting life anew in a fresh place.*
- *Wanted to write the story anew.*
- *Tears filled her eyes anew.*
- *Her career had begun anew, with a lucrative Japanese modelling contract.*

afresh	In a new or different way. <i>Start afresh.</i>
approaching	The temporal property of becoming nearer in time. <i>He warned of an approaching crisis.</i>
begin	Begin to speak or say. <i>The semester begins with a convocation ceremony.</i>
beginning	The act of starting something. <i>He left at the beginning of February.</i>
bracing	Imparting vitality and energy. <i>The bracing mountain air.</i>
budding	Beginning and showing promising signs of continuing. <i>Budding young actors.</i>

coming	The temporal property of becoming nearer in time. <i>This coming Thursday.</i>
emerging	Coming to maturity. <i>Established and emerging artists.</i>
forthcoming	About to happen or appear. <i>She had never been forthcoming about her time in the States.</i>
fresh	(of the wind) cool and fairly strong. <i>We are fresh out of tomatoes.</i>
freshly	Very recently. <i>Freshly ground black pepper.</i>
freshness	The quality of being pleasantly clean and cool. <i>He brings freshness to a familiar story.</i>
germinal	Providing material for future development. <i>De Beauvoir's germinal book <i>The Second Sex</i>.</i>
groundbreaking	Being or producing something like nothing done or experienced or created before. <i>Groundbreaking research into fertility problems.</i>
inaugurate	Admit (someone) formally to office. <i>He inaugurated a new policy of trade and exploration.</i>
inception	The establishment or starting point of an institution or activity. <i>She has been on the board since its inception two years ago.</i>
incipient	(of a person) developing into a specified type or role. <i>An incipient tumor.</i>
initial	Mark or sign a document with one's initials in order to authorize or validate it. <i>They carved their initials into the tree trunk.</i>
initially	At first. <i>Initially he thought the new concept was nonsense.</i>
nascent	Being born or beginning. <i>The nascent space industry.</i>
new	Beginning anew and in a transformed way. <i>A new baby.</i>
newly	Very recently. <i>Newly raised objections.</i>
novelty	Originality by virtue of being refreshingly novel. <i>In 1914 air travel was still a novelty.</i>
postwar	Belonging to the period after a war.

recency	The property of having happened or appeared not long ago.
recent	Having happened, begun, or been done not long ago; belonging to a past period comparatively close to the present. <i>In recent months.</i>
<u>refreshing</u>	Welcome or stimulating because new or different. <i>Her directness is refreshing.</i>
starting	Bulging or protruding as with fear. <i>His starting meant that the coach thought he was one of their best linemen.</i>
<u>thereafter</u>	After that time. <i>Thereafter she spent much of her life abroad.</i>
<u>unfamiliar</u>	Not known or recognized. <i>A name unfamiliar to most.</i>
