cherubic	Having a sweet nature befitting an angel or cherub. <i>A round cherubic face.</i>

innocent	Not knowledgeable about something specified. <i>She is a poor innocent young creature.</i>
<u>pure</u>	Being chromatically pure not diluted with white or grey or black. <i>Our fondness for each other is pure and innocent.</i>
sainted	Formally recognized as a saint; canonized. <i>He s a sainted figure on the Left holding one of the highest seats in their pantheon.</i>
saintlike	Marked by utter benignity; resembling or befitting an angel or saint.
saintly	Marked by utter benignity; resembling or befitting an angel or saint. <i>A truly saintly woman.</i>
seraphic	Of or relating to an angel of the first order. <i>Looking so seraphic when he slept.</i>
<u>sweet</u>	Having a sweet nature befitting an angel or cherub. <i>The sweet notes of the flute.</i>
<u>virtuous</u>	Morally excellent. <i>She considered herself very virtuous because she neither drank nor smoked.</i>
<u>wholesome</u>	Conducive to or suggestive of good health and physical well-being. <i>Good wholesome fun.</i>

ecclesiastic	Of or associated with a church (especially a Christian Church). <i>Ecclesiastic history.</i>
godly	Devoutly religious; pious. <i>Everything is black or white satanic or godly.</i>
hallowed	Made holy; consecrated. <i>Hallowed ground.</i>
<u>heavenly</u>	Of or belonging to heaven or god. <i>Their shampoos smell heavenly.</i>
holy	Dedicated or consecrated to God or a religious purpose; sacred. <i>I do not lead a holy life.</i>
liturgy	A religious service conducted according to a liturgy. <i>At the conclusion of the liturgy the Bishop presented the certificates.</i>
omniscience	The state of being omniscient; having infinite knowledge. <i>His reputation for near omniscience and infallibility.</i>
pharisaic	Excessively or hypocritically pious.
<u>pilgrimage</u>	Go on a pilgrimage. <i>A place of pilgrimage.</i>
<u>pious</u>	(of a hope) sincere but unlikely to be fulfilled. <i>His pious platitudes.</i>
religious	A member of a religious order who is bound by vows of poverty and chastity and obedience. <i>A religious man.</i>
<u>reverent</u>	Showing great reverence for god. <i>A reverent silence.</i>
<u>reverential</u>	Of the nature of, due to, or characterized by reverence. <i>Their names are always mentioned in reverential tones.</i>

sacrament	(in Roman Catholic use) the consecrated elements of the Eucharist, especially the bread or Host. <i>They used peyote as a sacrament.</i>
sacred	Made or declared or believed to be holy; devoted to a deity or some religious ceremony or use. <i>Cows are sacred and the eating of beef is taboo.</i>
sacrilege	Blasphemous behavior; the act of depriving something of its sacred character. <i>Putting ecclesiastical vestments to secular use was considered sacrilege.</i>
saintly	Marked by utter benignity; resembling or befitting an angel or saint. <i>A crypt for some saintly relic.</i>
<u>sanctity</u>	The quality of being holy. <i>The site of the tomb was a place of sanctity for the ancient Egyptians.</i>
scripture	Any writing that is regarded as sacred by a religious group. <i>The fundamental teachings of the scriptures.</i>
seraphic	Of or relating to an angel of the first order. <i>He imagined a seraphic presence in the room.</i>
<u>shrine</u>	Enshrine. <i>A Hindu shrine at which offerings are placed twice a day.</i>
supernal	Of exceptional quality or extent. <i>Supernal erudition.</i>
