enraged	Marked by extreme anger. An <b>enraged</b> mob screamed abuse.
furious	(of the elements) as if showing violent anger. <i>Furious</i> about the accident.
infuriated	Marked by extreme anger. <i>Infuriated</i> onlookers charged the police who were beating the boy.
maddened	Marked by extreme anger. <i>Could not control the <b>maddened</b> crowd.</i>





# Associations of "Angered" (30 Words)

aggravate	Annoy or exasperate. This drug <b>aggravate</b> s the pain.
aggression	Violent action that is hostile and usually unprovoked. The president has been emboldened by the success of his latest <b>aggression</b> s.
<u>annoy</u>	Cause annoyance in disturb especially by minor irritations. The decision really <b>annoy</b> ed him.
antagonism	The relation between opposing principles or forces or factors. The inherent <b>antagonism</b> of capitalism and socialism.
disaffection	A state or feeling of being dissatisfied, especially with people in authority or a system of control. <i>The widespread disaffection of the troops.</i>



enrage	Make (someone) very angry. The students were <b>enrage</b> d at these new rules.
exacerbate	Exasperate or irritate. The exorbitant cost of land in urban areas only <b>exacerbate</b> d the problem.
exasperate	Exasperate or irritate. This futile process <b>exasperate</b> s prison officers.
fractious	Stubbornly resistant to authority or control. They fight and squabble like <b>fractious</b> children.
fret	Provide a musical instrument with frets. Don t <b>fret</b> over these small details.
incense	The smoke or perfume of incense. The sharp lingering sweetness of <b>incense</b> .
inconvenient	Not suited to your comfort, purpose or needs. An early departure is <b>inconvenient</b> for us.
indignation	A feeling of righteous anger. The letter filled Lucy with <b>indignation</b> .
inflame	Become inflamed get sore. The repetitive motion <b>inflame</b> d her joint.
infuriate	Make (someone) extremely angry and impatient. I was <b>infuriate</b> d by your article.
irritate	Excite to an abnormal condition, or chafe or inflame. <i>Irritate</i> the glands of a leaf.
<u>irritation</u>	A sudden outburst of anger. Any food produced <b>irritation</b> of the stomach.
madden	Drive (someone or something) insane. This is ridiculous she told him <b>madden</b> ed by his reaction.
miff	A state of irritation or annoyance. A doctor might be <b>miff</b> ed by claims that the cure had no medical explanation.
offend	Be displeasing or cause problems to. Those activities which <b>offend</b> against public order and decency.
outrage	An action or event causing outrage. The public were <b>outrage</b> d at the brutality involved.
peevish	Having or showing an irritable disposition. A thin <b>peevish</b> voice.
<u>petulant</u>	Easily irritated or annoyed. A <b>petulant</b> shake of the head.



pique	A sudden outburst of anger. She was <b>pique</b> d by his curtness.
rage	Violent state of the elements. She fell into a <b>rage</b> and refused to answer.
resentment	A feeling of deep and bitter anger and ill-will. His <b>resentment</b> at being demoted.
sadden	Cause to feel sorrow; make unhappy. The news of her death <b>sadden</b> ed me.
testy	Easily irritated or annoyed. She could see him growing quite <b>testy</b> beneath that polished urbanity.
touchy	Quick to take offense. She s a little <b>touchy</b> about her age.
<u>worsen</u>	Make or become worse. Arguing actually <b>worsen</b> s the problem.
