## Associations of "Angering" (30 Words)

<b>aggravate</b>	Exasperate or irritate. <i>This drug <b>aggravates</b> the pain.</i>
<b>aggression</b>	Forcefulness. <i>The president has been emboldened by the success of his latest <b>aggressions</b>.</i>
<b><a href="#">annoy</a></b>	Cause annoyance in disturb especially by minor irritations. <i>A gallant Saxon who <b>annoyed</b> this Coast.</i>
<b>antagonism</b>	An actively expressed feeling of dislike and hostility. <i>The <b>antagonism</b> between them.</i>
<b>disaffection</b>	Disloyalty to the government or to established authority. <i>The widespread <b>disaffection</b> of the troops.</i>
<b>enrage</b>	Make (someone) very angry. <i>The students were <b>enraged</b> at these new rules.</i>
<b>exacerbate</b>	Make (a problem, bad situation, or negative feeling) worse. <i>The exorbitant cost of land in urban areas only <b>exacerbated</b> the problem.</i>
<b>exasperate</b>	Exasperate or irritate. <i>This futile process <b>exasperates</b> prison officers.</i>
<b>fractious</b>	Stubbornly resistant to authority or control. <i>They fight and squabble like <b>fractious</b> children.</i>
<b><a href="#">fret</a></b>	Provide a musical instrument with frets. <i>Why would anyone get themselves in a <b>fret</b> over something so simple.</i>
<b>incense</b>	The smoke or perfume of incense. <i>The aroma of cannabis <b>incensed</b> the air.</i>
<b>inconvenient</b>	Not suited to your comfort, purpose or needs. <i>It is <b>inconvenient</b> not to have a telephone in the kitchen.</i>
<b>indignation</b>	A feeling of righteous anger. <i>The letter filled Lucy with <b>indignation</b>.</i>

<b>inflame</b>	Become inflamed get sore. <i>Comments that <b>inflame</b> what is already a sensitive situation.</i>
<b>infuriate</b>	Make furious. <i>I was <b>infuriated</b> by your article.</i>
<b>irritate</b>	Make (someone) annoyed or a little angry. <i><b>Irritate</b> the glands of a leaf.</i>
<b><u>irritation</u></b>	The state of feeling annoyed, impatient, or slightly angry. <i>Any food produced <b>irritation</b> of the stomach.</i>
<b>madden</b>	Drive up the wall; go on someone's nerves. <i>She was almost <b>maddened</b> by grief at his loss.</i>
<b>miff</b>	A petty quarrel or fit of pique. <i>Like ladies in a <b>miff</b> who won't explain.</i>
<b>offend</b>	Strike with disgust or revulsion. <i>17 per cent of viewers said they had been <b>offended</b> by bad language.</i>
<b>outrage</b>	An action or event causing outrage. <i>Their behaviour <b>outraged</b> all civilized standards.</i>
<b>peevish</b>	Easily irritated or annoyed. <i>A thin <b>peevish</b> voice.</i>
<b><u>petulant</u></b>	(of a person or their manner) childishly sulky or bad-tempered. <i>A <b>petulant</b> shake of the head.</i>
<b>pique</b>	A feeling of irritation or resentment resulting from a slight, especially to one's pride. <i>Men who are thought to <b>pique</b> themselves upon their Wit.</i>
<b>rage</b>	(of an illness or fire) spread very rapidly or uncontrollably. <i>Office <b>rage</b> is on the increase.</i>
<b>resentment</b>	Bitter indignation at having been treated unfairly. <i>His <b>resentment</b> at being demoted.</i>
<b>sadden</b>	Cause to feel sorrow; make unhappy. <i>The news of her death <b>saddened</b> me.</i>
<b>testy</b>	Easily irritated; impatient and somewhat bad-tempered. <i>His <b>testy</b> disapproving father.</i>
<b>touchy</b>	Quick to take offense. <i>The monarchy has become a <b>touchy</b> topic.</i>
<b><u>worsen</u></b>	Make worse. <i>Her condition <b>worsened</b> on the flight.</i>
