aggravate Exasperate or irritate.

The aroma of cannabis **incense**d the air.

Not suited to your comfort, purpose or needs.

indignation A feeling of righteous anger.

incense

inflame Become inflamed get sore.

Comments that **inflame** what is already a sensitive situation.

infuriate Make furious.

I was **infuriate**d by your article.

irritate Make (someone) annoyed or a little angry.

**Irritate** the glands of a leaf.

The state of feeling annoyed, impatient, or slightly angry.

Any food produced **irritation** of the stomach.

madden Drive up the wall; go on someone's nerves.

She was almost **madden**ed by grief at his loss.

miff A petty quarrel or fit of pique.

Like ladies in a **miff** who won t explain.

offend Strike with disgust or revulsion.

17 per cent of viewers said they had been **offend**ed by bad language.

outrage

An action or event causing outrage.

Their behaviour **outrage**d all civilized standards.

**Peevish** Easily irritated or annoyed.

A thin **peevish** voice.

(of a person or their manner) childishly sulky or bad-tempered.

A **petulant** shake of the head.

A feeling of irritation or resentment resulting from a slight, especially to

**pique** one's pride.

Men who are thought to **pique** themselves upon their Wit.

(of an illness or fire) spread very rapidly or uncontrollably.

office **rage** is on the increase.

resentment Bitter indignation at having been treated unfairly.
