Associations of "Angering" (30 Words)

aggravate	Exasperate or irritate. <i>This drug aggravates the pain.</i>
aggression	Forcefulness. <i>The president has been emboldened by the success of his latest aggressions.</i>
annoy	Cause annoyance in disturb especially by minor irritations. <i>A gallant Saxon who annoyed this Coast.</i>
antagonism	An actively expressed feeling of dislike and hostility. <i>The antagonism between them.</i>
disaffection	Disloyalty to the government or to established authority. <i>The widespread disaffection of the troops.</i>
enrage	Make (someone) very angry. <i>The students were enraged at these new rules.</i>
exacerbate	Make (a problem, bad situation, or negative feeling) worse. <i>The exorbitant cost of land in urban areas only exacerbated the problem.</i>
exasperate	Exasperate or irritate. <i>This futile process exasperates prison officers.</i>
fractious	Stubbornly resistant to authority or control. <i>They fight and squabble like fractious children.</i>
fret	Provide a musical instrument with frets. <i>Why would anyone get themselves in a fret over something so simple.</i>
incense	The smoke or perfume of incense. <i>The aroma of cannabis incensed the air.</i>
inconvenient	Not suited to your comfort, purpose or needs. <i>It is inconvenient not to have a telephone in the kitchen.</i>
indignation	A feeling of righteous anger. <i>The letter filled Lucy with indignation.</i>

inflame	Become inflamed get sore. <i>Comments that inflame what is already a sensitive situation.</i>
infuriate	Make furious. <i>I was infuriated by your article.</i>
irritate	Make (someone) annoyed or a little angry. <i>Irritate the glands of a leaf.</i>
<u>irritation</u>	The state of feeling annoyed, impatient, or slightly angry. <i>Any food produced irritation of the stomach.</i>
madden	Drive up the wall; go on someone's nerves. <i>She was almost maddened by grief at his loss.</i>
miff	A petty quarrel or fit of pique. <i>Like ladies in a miff who won't explain.</i>
offend	Strike with disgust or revulsion. <i>17 per cent of viewers said they had been offended by bad language.</i>
outrage	An action or event causing outrage. <i>Their behaviour outraged all civilized standards.</i>
peevish	Easily irritated or annoyed. <i>A thin peevish voice.</i>
<u>petulant</u>	(of a person or their manner) childishly sulky or bad-tempered. <i>A petulant shake of the head.</i>
pique	A feeling of irritation or resentment resulting from a slight, especially to one's pride. <i>Men who are thought to pique themselves upon their Wit.</i>
rage	(of an illness or fire) spread very rapidly or uncontrollably. <i>Office rage is on the increase.</i>
resentment	Bitter indignation at having been treated unfairly. <i>His resentment at being demoted.</i>
sadden	Cause to feel sorrow; make unhappy. <i>The news of her death saddened me.</i>
testy	Easily irritated; impatient and somewhat bad-tempered. <i>His testy disapproving father.</i>
touchy	Quick to take offense. <i>The monarchy has become a touchy topic.</i>
<u>worsen</u>	Make worse. <i>Her condition worsened on the flight.</i>
