extirpation The act of pulling up or out; uprooting; cutting off from existence.

killingAn event that causes someone to die. Years of **killing** and destruction.

liquidationThe killing of someone, typically by violent means.

The company went into liquidation.

Great skillfulness and knowledge of some subject or activity.

mastery *Man s mastery* over nature.

obliteration The complete destruction of every trace of something.

Headlines about the **obliteration** of the green belt.

overthrow A score made because the ball has been overthrown.

His throw missed the stumps and went for four **overthrow**s.

rout A pack of wolves.
