## **Anniversary as a Noun**

### **Definitions of "Anniversary" as a noun**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “anniversary” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *The date on which a couple were married in a previous year.*
- *The date on which an event took place or an institution was founded in a previous year.*
- *The date on which an event occurred in some previous year (or the celebration of it).*
- *The date on which a romance began in a previous month or week.*



### Synonyms of "Anniversary" as a noun (3 Words)

**commemoration** A ceremony or celebration in which a person or event is remembered.

*Commemorations of wartime anniversaries.*

**day of remembrance** An era of existence or influence.

**jubilee** A year of emancipation and restoration, kept every fifty years.  
*To celebrate its jubilee the club is holding a tournament.*

- *The 50th anniversary of the Battle of Britain.*
- *The 75th anniversary of the RAF.*
- *He even forgot our tenth anniversary!*



## Associations of "Anniversary" (30 Words)

<b>annually</b>	By the year; every year (usually with reference to a sum of money paid or received). <i>They travel to China <b>annually</b>.</i>
<b>banquet</b>	Provide a feast or banquet for. <i>Ambassadors were fabulously <b>banqueted</b> and loaded with gifts.</i>
<b>bicentennial</b>	The 200th anniversary (or the celebration of it). <i><b>Bicentennial</b> celebration.</i>
<b><u>birthday</u></b>	An anniversary of the day on which a person was born (or the celebration of it). <i>The seventy fifth <b>birthday</b> of the Institute.</i>
<b>celebrate</b>	Have a celebration. <i>The film director was <b>celebrated</b> all over Hollywood.</i>

<b>celebration</b>	The public performance of a sacrament or solemn ceremony with all appropriate ritual. <i>The birth of his son was a cause for <b>celebration</b>.</i>
<b>celebratory</b>	Feeling or expressing happiness and pride. <i>The impending anniversary has the restaurant in a <b>celebratory</b> mood.</i>
<b>centenary</b>	The 100th anniversary (or the celebration of it). <i>The society has just celebrated its <b>centenary</b>.</i>
<b>centennial</b>	A hundredth anniversary. <i><b>Centennial</b> celebrations.</i>
<b>ceremony</b>	Formal polite behaviour. <i>He showed them to their table with great <b>ceremony</b>.</i>
<b><u>commemorate</u></b>	Celebrate by some ceremony or observation. <i>This sculpture <b>commemorates</b> the victims of the concentration camps.</i>
<b>coronation</b>	The ceremony of crowning a sovereign or a sovereign's consort. <i>The Queen s <b>coronation</b>.</i>
<b><u>feast</u></b>	Provide a feast or banquet for. <i>They <b>feasted</b> the deputation.</i>
<b><u>festival</u></b>	A day or period of celebration, typically for religious reasons. <i>A major international <b>festival</b> of song.</i>
<b><u>festive</u></b>	Relating to a festival, especially Christmas. <i>The sombre atmosphere has given way to a <b>festive</b> mood.</i>
<b>fete</b>	Have a celebration. <i>A church <b>fete</b>.</i>
<b>gala</b>	A gay festivity. <i>A <b>gala</b> performance by the Royal Ballet.</i>
<b><u>memorial</u></b>	Intended to commemorate someone or something. <i>A <b>memorial</b> service in the dead man s honour.</i>
<b>memorialize</b>	Preserve the memory of; commemorate. <i>The novel <b>memorialized</b> their childhood summers.</i>
<b>parade</b>	A parade ground. <i>She made a <b>parade</b> of her sorrows.</i>
<b>perennially</b>	In a perennial manner; repeatedly. <i>A lily that grows <b>perennially</b> from bulbs.</i>
<b>plaque</b>	(pathology) a small abnormal patch on or inside the body. <i><b>Plaque</b> around gum margins can lead to gingivitis.</i>
<b>potlatch</b>	Hold a potlatch.

<b>reminder</b>	A letter sent to remind someone of an obligation, especially to pay a bill. <i>He ignored his wife s <b>reminders</b>.</i>
<b>revelry</b>	Lively and noisy festivities, especially when these involve drinking a large amount of alcohol. <i>Sounds of <b>revelry</b> issued into the night.</i>
<b>semiannual</b>	Occurring or payable twice each year.
<b>tercentenary</b>	The 300th anniversary (or the celebration of it). <i>His <b>tercentenary</b> year.</i>
<b>triennial</b>	A visitation of an Anglican diocese by its bishop every three years. <i>The <b>triennial</b> meeting of the Association.</i>
<b>wedding</b>	A party of people at a wedding.
<b>yearly</b>	Occurring or payable every year. <i><b>Yearly</b> medical examinations.</i>
